ORDER

A regular bail petition has been filed on behalf of the accused petitioner namely (1) Vikram Kumar Singh who is in jail custody since 24.03.2026 in connection with Hasanganj P.S. Case No. 79/2026 for the offences U/S 103(1), 238 of BNS. The copy of the same has been duly served to the Ld. Addl. P.P. for the State.

Heard the Ld. counsel for the petitioner and the learned A.P.P. for the State.

The Ld. counsel of the petitioner has submitted that no B.P. or A.B.P. on behalf of the accused petitioner has been filed or moved before this court or before the Hon'ble High Court, Patna. The petitioner is quite innocent and has not committed any offence at all and he has been falsely implicated in this case. There is no specific allegation against the petitioner. Petitioner has no criminal antecedent except the present case. That the petitioner belongs to a farmer family. Petitioner is ready to abide by the terms and conditions imposed by this court. Petitioner is ready to furnish local and solvent bailors to the satisfaction of the court and there is no chance of absconding. Accordingly, prayed to grant anticipatory bail.

On the other hand, the Ld. Addl. P.P. opposed the prayer of B.P. filed on behalf of the above named accused petitioner and submitted that the petitioner has committed the alleged offence under well planned manner. Hence, it is requested to reject the petition of the above named accused petitioner.

The case of the prosecution, in brief, is that the deceased, who had been living separately from her husband for the last five years, was residing at her parental home and working at the petitioner's house for livelihood. On the night of 13.03.2026, the informant's granddaughter noticed a person lying on the ground. Thereafter, the informant's son found that the deceased was not breathing and someone was fleeing from the spot. The informant

suspected that the petitioner had killed the deceased, left the body there and absconded. Hence, the present case

Heard the Ld. Counsel of both the parties and perused the case diary. From the perusal of case diary, it transpires that the present Hasanganj P.S. Case No. 79/2026 has been registered U/S 103(1), 238 of BNS. The petitioner is the named accused of the FIR and there is a allegation of a serious and heinous offence involving murder. The death occurred during night hours under suspicious circumstances. As per post-mortem report, the cause of death is asphyxia, as a result of throttling which is clearly homicidal. There is sufficient material in case diary against the petitioner. The informant suspected and alleged that after the occurrence, a persons was seen fleeing from the spot. Though the petitioner has got clean antecedent, but allegations are serious in nature and investigation of this case is still pending.

Hence, considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances and discussions made hereinabove and keeping in mind the seriousness of accusation and gravity of offences, I am not inclined to enlarge the petitioner on bail. Accordingly, prayer for bail of the above named accused petitioner stands **rejected**.
