ORDER

13.07.2026- This anticipatory bail petition has been filed on the behalf of accused-petitioner namely Md. Iftekhar Alam, who is apprehending his arrest in connection with aforesaid case.

Heard the ld. counsel Shri Vijay Kumar Jha appearing on the behalf of the petitioner and Ld. Counsel Shri Ahsanul Haque on behalf of the informant as well as ld. A.P.P. Shri Md. Azaj Alam on the behalf of the state.

As per F.I.R. prosecution case in nutshell is that informant to this case namely Afsana Khatoon lodged a written report before S.H.O Azamnagar alleging therein that on dated 30.06.2025 at about 07:00 O'clock she was doing some work in her house at that time accused-petitioner namely Md. Iftekhar Alam and other accused named in F.I.R. started abusing her and told to her to demand some land from her father and when she protested to do so then all accused persons brutally assaulted her by the means of leg and fist and her husband Md. Iftekhar Alam started saying that if the cash and land is not given by her father then he may kill her and he may solemnized his second marriage. Informant has further alleged that earlier to this he has hung her on ceiling fan with view to take her life away. She has further stated that she has altogether three children. Informant has further alleged that accused-petitioner got her and her children ousted from matrimonial house after that she went to her parental house.

On the other side learned counsel for the petitioner has reiterated all the grounds taken in the bail petition and has submitted that the petitioner is quite innocent and has committed no offence at all and the petitioner has falsely been implicated in this case due personal grudge. He has further submitted that there is no hand of petitioner either directly or indirectly for

the commission of the said offence and petitioner never demand dowry and never tortured her and he has not ousted her from his house, in fact she was not willing to live a conjugal life with her husband. He has further submitted that petitioner is ready to keep her with full dignity and honour. Accordingly, it has been prayed to allow the anticipatory bail petition.

Per contra, learned A.P.P. has vehemently opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail.

Heard the both parties and perused the record from perusal of the case record it is evident that only general and omnibus allegation relating to demand of cash and land in dowry and to commit of physical and mental torture to the informant by the accused-petitioner and his family members have been levelled against the petitioner but there is no specific allegation against the petitioner. Further, any medical prescription is not on the record relating to physical assault of the informant. Moreover, investigation has already been completed against the present petitioner. So, it is evident that there is no requirement of interrogation of the petitioner by the I.O. in this case.

So having consideration the above facts and submission made by the Ld. Counsel for the petitioner, the instant anticipatory bail petition is hereby allowed and accordingly it is ordered to release the petitioner namely Md. Iftekhar Alam on bail in the case of surrender/arrest within three weeks of this order on furnishing of bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court concerned subject to the condition as mentioned in the section 482(2) of the B.N.S.S..
