	10.07.2026	1. This anticipatory bail petition, filed on behalf of petitioners namely 1. Sunil Kumar, 2. Rinku Kumari, 3. Khushbu Kumari, 4. Somani Devi, 5. Ramchandra Mandal & 6. Fekan Mandal, seeking pre-arrest bail in connection with Phulparas P.S case No- 160/2026, U/s- 147, 148, 149, 341, 323, 324, 379, 504, 506, 307 of the IPC.U/s- 85, 115(2), 110, 3(5) of the BNS & ¾ Dowry Act. 2. Heard Sri Balram Sahu, Ld. Advocate on behalf of aforesaid petitioners and Sri Indrakant Prasad learned APP for the state. 3. Learned counsel Sri Balram Sahu on behalf of the petitioners has submitted that earlier no other bail petition has been filed on behalf of these petitioners either before Sessions Court or before Hon'ble High Court Patna and petitioners have no criminal antecedent and are quite innocent, have committed no offence as alleged in the FIR. It is further submitted that petitioners have falsely been implicated in this case due to matrimonial dispute in between the parties with intention to harass and pressurize the husband and his family members and alleged allegation against the petitioners is false, baseless and fabricated. It is also submitted that petitioners neither demanded the dowry nor tortured the informant, hence U/s 85 of the BNS and 3/4 D.P. Act is not applicable against the petitioners and the case has been compromised in between the parties. Lastly it is submitted that petitioners are apprehending their arrest, ld. Counsel prayed to enlarge the petitioners on anticipatory bail. 4. The learned APP Sri Indrakant Prasad opposed the bail petition and prayed to reject it. 5. The prosecution case in short is that, the informant of this case is Radha	

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Contd. 10.07.2026	Kumari, she has alleged that she got married with Sunil Kumar and blessed a son, who is three years old and she is pregnant by three months. Further it is alleged that all the accused persons named in FIR tortured her for demand of dowry and also physically assaulted her, on 19.03.2026 at about 01:00 P.M., her husband Sunil Kumar assaulted with intention to kill over her head by means of lathi, resulted she became injured and on 19.04.2026 accused persons also assaulted and tried to hang her and snatched ornaments, Hence, this case. 6. Heard both sides at the length on this instant anticipatory bail petition and perused the case record along with case diary including injury report available. From perusal of the record it transpires that it is a case of torture for demand of dowry and petitioners are named in FIR, the allegation against the petitioners is to torture physically and mentally to the victim. From perusal it also transpires that the matter has been compromised in between the parties and a joint compromise petition bearing signature of both the parties dully verified by their advocates is also annexed with the bail petition. In spite of that from perusal of injury report it transpires that injury report does not corroborate the case of the prosecution as alleged in the FIR. Apart from that the victim and her husband are present in the Court and the victim has conceded the content of compromise with the accused petitioners and specifically stated that she have no any grievance if the petitioners be enlarged on bail. 7. Therefore, considering the facts and circumstances discussed above as well as good relation restored in between the parties, I am inclined to enlarge the petitioners on bail, in the event of their arrest or surrender before the Ld. Court below within a period of 21 days from receipt of this order, the petitioners namely 1. Sunil Kumar, 2. Rinku Kumari, 3. Khushbu Kumari, 4. Somani

Fekan Mandal, be enlarged on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of Ld. Court below, as condition laid u/s 482 of BNSS, with further following conditions; I. That the petitioners will not torture and will not demand of dowry from the victim or her family members. II. That the petitioner No. 01 will furnish a separate affidavit stating that he will keep his wife with full dignity and honor and will not torture her for demand of dowry in future from the victim or his family members. III. That the petitioners will co-operate in trial and they will make themselves available whenever required by the Court Concerned. IV. An undertaking to follow the conditions as above be given on behalf of petitioners accused along with bail bond, in case of violation and breach of the conditions, the prosecution will be at liberty to move for cancellation of their bail bond.
