ORDER

This anticipatory bail petition filed under section 482 B.N.S.S. on behalf of the above named petitioner **Mukesh Pal** who is apprehending his arrest in connection with **Khutauna P.S. Case No. 68/2026** for the offence **under section 126(2), 115(2), 118(2), 109(1), 303(2), 351(2), 352, 3(5) of BNS** which is pending in the court of Smt. F.N. Fatma, J.M.1st Class, Jhanjharpur, is being pressed and heard.

The prosecution case in brief on the basis of typed application of Nitish Kumar is that his sister's wedding was on 30.04.2026, due to which he was very worried. At about 11 PM, he went to pick up his friend Md. Israel from his house. When he was returning with him, in the meantime Santosh Kumar, Rahul Kumar, Birju Kumar, Shankar Kumar, Pankaj Kumar, Kanhaiya Kumar, Mukesh Pal, Suresh Kumar, Kamlesh Kumar, Bhukkur Kumar, Sanjiv Kumar, and some unknown 20 persons surrounded him and his friend, and started beating them with sticks and iron rod. He kept asking again and again what happened. Let them go home, the wedding procession has arrived at his doorstep, but none of them listened, and continued to attacking him, causing a serious injury to his head, which fractured, and he fell unconscious. He had Rs. 11,000/- in his pocket and a golden chain to give to his sister, and they snatched that too. Some women and Md. Amanulla came to his rescue, but Rahul Kumar and all his companions attacked him together. Rahul Kumar

assaulted Md. Amanulla with a stick and iron rod, causing fracture to his head. All of them beaten them, then Kamlesh Kumar snatched Md. Amanulla's mobile, threw it at him, breaking the mobile, and took out Rs. 15,000/- from Md. Amanulla's pocket. He and Md. Amanulla vehicles no. are BR32AZ5810, and BR32AV8981 were also vandalized. The people from nearby came, and everyone ran away. Hence, this case.

Learned counsel for the accused petitioners submits that the accused petitioner is innocent, and have not committed any offence. He had no criminal antecedent. The petitioner has been falsely implicated in this case due to malice, spite, grudge, and dirty village party politics. Nothing incriminating has been recovered from the possession of the petitioners. Accordingly, he prays to grant anticipatory bail to the accused petitioner.

Learned APP had opposed the prayer of anticipatory bail.

Heard the argument and perused the case diary. Petitioner do not bear any criminal antecedent. From documents filed, it is apparent that petitioner side has also filed a case bearing Khutauna P.S case no-72/26. Meaning thereby that fight took place. Injury sustained by injured are simple in nature, caused by hard and blunt substance. Allegations are general and omnibus in nature. Considering all these facts and circumstances, this court find this to be an apt case for grant of anticipatory bail. Hence, anticipatory bail petition of petitioner **Mukesh Pal** is **allowed**. It is hereby ordered that in the event of surrender of arrest before the court below/concerned police within 30 days from the date of receipt of a copy of this order, the petitioner shall be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below/police subject to the condition under the provision of section 482(2) BNSS.
