ORDER

This application for regular bail filed under section 483 BNSS on behalf of the above named petitioner Abhimanyu Kumar alias Mannu Kumar, who is in custody since 18.02.2026 in connection with Alamnagar P.S. Case No. 321 of 2025 u/ss. 190, 191 (2), 126(2), 127(2), 115(2), 117(2), 109 (1), 74, 351(2) and 352 of the BNS, is pressed today for hearing.

Heard Sri Gajendra Prasad Yadav, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner and Sri Bibeka Kumar Singh, learned P.P. appearing on behalf of the State of Bihar.

It is alleged in the First Information Report by the informant Deepak Kumar Mandal that on 07.11.2025 at about 17:00 hours when the informant was returning from Bajraha Chowk to his house by sitting on the motor-cycle of one Nivas Yadav and when the informant reached near Kala Manch, Sarswati Mandir then F.I.R. named accused persons, namely, Rupesh Kumar, Ritesh Kumar and Chhoti alias Suman stopped the motor-cycle, got the informant down from the motorcycle by catching hold his color and they said to the informant to call Jyotish on phone. The accused Rupesh started telling to the informant that he will caste his vote to the outsider and not to caste vote to the villager. Till then other six co-accused persons named in the F.I.R. including the petitioner being armed with lathi, danda and rod reached there and all started assaulting to the informant with intention to kill and when the informant raised alarm in order to save himself then on hearing his sound informant's mother Ranju Devi and informant's neighbours, namely, Santosh Mandal, Sanni Mandal, Jyotish Kumar and Kailu Mandal reached there to save the informant. Till then all accused persons assaulted to the informant and got him injured severely. When the informant's mother started to save him then all accused persons dashed her and assaulted to her. When the above named persons started to intervene then they were also assaulted by the accused persons with lathi and danda. When the villagers started assembling there then all the above named nine accused persons including the petitioner fled away with threatening to face dire consequence if the informant will not obey them.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner submitted that the petitioner in in judicial custody since 18.02.2026. The petitioner has no criminal history at all. The petitioner is innocent and has been falsely implicated in this case. No specific allegation of any kind is

alleged against the petitioner rather there is general and omnibus allegation against all accused persons. It is further submitted on behalf of the petitioner that co-accused persons, namely, Rupesh Kumar, Ritesh Kumar and Chhotu alias Suman have been granted regular bail by this court vide order dated 11.12.2025 passed in B.P. No. 2376 of 2025 and the case of the petitioner stands on similar footing.

Learned Public Prosecutor appearing on behalf of the State of Bihar opposed the prayer for regular bail of the petitioner.

Perused the lower court's case record coupled with the xerox copy of case diary. As per injury reports of injured persons, which are available on the case diary, it appears that injuries of injured persons, namely, Santosh Mandal, Ranju Devi, Jyotish Kumar and Santosh Mandal have been found simple in nature by the doctor. As per injury report of injured, namely, Sanjay Kumar, which is available on the case diary, that he was advised for x-ray of left Arm but till date no report with X-ray plate has been submitted. As per injury report of injured, namely, Deepak Kumar, which is available on the case diary, that he was advised for x-ray of left forearm but till date no report with X-ray plate has been submitted. The petitioner is in custody since 18.02.2026. It appears that co-accused persons, namely, Rupesh Kumar, Ritesh Kumar and Chhotu alias Suman have been granted regular bail by this court vide order dated 11.12.2025 passed in B.P. No. 2376 of 2025 and the case of the petitioner appears to be stand on similar footing.

Considering the above facts, circumstances of the case as well as considering the period of detention of the petitioner in custody since 18.02.2026, the petitioner – Abhimanyu Kumar alias Mannu Kumar is directed to be released on bail on his furnishing a bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten Thousand) with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below in connection with Alamnagar P.S. Case No. 321 of 2025 with conditions that (1) one of the bailors will be close relative of the petitioner and (2) the petitioner will remain physically present before the trial court on each and every date during trial of the case failing which his bail bond will be cancelled automatically.
