27.04.2026 Petition for regular bail filed on behalf of above named petitioner, who is in jail custody since 14.01.2026 in connection with Bihariganj P.S. Case No. 498/2025 u/ss. 126 (2), 115 (2), 118 (1), 117 (2), 109 (1), 303 (2), 352, 351 (2) and 3 (5) of the B.N.S., is pressed today for hearing.

Heard Sri Braj Bhushan Kumar, learned counsel for the petitioner and Sri Bibeka Kumar Singh, learned P.P. for the State.

According to F.I.R., the basic allegation against the petitioner is that on 02.12.2025 at 10.00 hours while the informant had gone to plough his land obtained through sale-deed, the petitioner along with five co-accused persons named in the F.I.R. and three unknown persons came there, abused the informant and began to commit mar-pit. The petitioner assaulted with the butt of three-nut on the head of the informant and caused rupture injury. The petitioner also asked the informant to take cultivable land in lieu of homestead land otherwise the petitioner would murder the informant. It is further alleged that one mobile of Vivo company and cash of Rs. 5,000/- have also been snatched away from the informant.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is innocent and has not committed offence as alleged in the F.I.R. The petitioner has made accused in this case by levelling false allegation against him. The informant and the petitioner are agnates and dispute regarding partition of land between them is going on from before. It is further submitted that on offence of the petitioner that no offence under section 109 (1) B.N.S.


stands made out against the petitioner and offence under section 303 (2) B.N.S. appears to be ornamental and super addition and other sections of B.N.S. are bailable in nature. The petitioner is in judicial custody since 14.01.2026.

Learned P.P. appearing on behalf of State opposed the prayer for regular bail of petitioner.

Perused the lower court's case record coupled with the case diary. The petitioner is not named in the F.I.R. From perusal of supplementary injury, which is available on the case diary, that no bony injury has been found on the person of the injured and hence the injury was simple in nature as opined by the doctor. As per paragraph – 63 of the case diary it appears that charge-sheet has already been submitted against the petitioner vide charge-sheet No. 87 of 2026 dated 03.03.2026.

Considering the facts and circumstances of the case and also considering the period of detention of the petitioner in judicial custody since 14.01.2026, the petitioner Lalbahadur Mandal is directed to be released on bail on his furnishing a bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (rupees ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned lower court in connection with Bihariganj P.S. Case No. 498 of 2025.
