ORDER

Date : 11/06/2026

1. The above named petitioner seeks “Anticipatory Bail” in connection with **Minapur P.S. Case No. 202/2026** for offences punishable u/ss 126(2), 115(2), 74, 303(2), 52, 351(2), 3(5) of the BNS and due to apprehension of their arrest in this case. Copy of the same has been served to Ld. Addl.P.P. on behalf of State.
2. The learned counsel for the petitioners has submitted that the petitioners are innocent and have committed no offence and have falsely been implicated in this case and petitioner no. 1 & 3 have got one criminal antecedent, furthermore there is no criminal antecedent against the petitioners. It is further submitted that the petitioner Abhay Kumar Singh has filed an F.I.R. against the informant and his wife and children at Minapur P.S. Case No. 191/2026 & 78/2017 and partition suit no. 66/2017. In order to escape from the case, the informant has filed a counter case. It is further submitted that there is a land dispute between the informant and the petitioners and the the informant put undue pressure on the petitioners to withdraw the earlier case and the petitioners refused to do so, due to which the informant lodged the F.I.R. against the petitioners. Hence, prayed for anticipatory bail.
3. On behalf of, the Ld. A.P.P. for the State has opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail.
4. The prosecution story in brief of the informant Sanjay Kumar Singh is that on 24.04.2026 around 6 AM, petitioners came to his house with sticks, iron rods and surrounded him from all sides, abusing him and said that give half the pension money of father, he said that the pension money his father himself has consumed and spent the money, then Abhay Kumar Singh and Mangalam Kumar together with the intention to kill him, wrapped a rope around his neck and began to strangle him and when he started struggling in pain, then Mangalman Kumar swung an iron rod on his head with the intention to kill. He stepped back and the iron rod hit the left side of his rib cage, fracturing his rib. At that moment, all of them together started beating him with kicks, punches and sticks, causing severe injuries to his head, left hand, mouth and nose and his nasal bone fractured and started bleeding profusely. When his wife, Anshu Kumar came to rescue him, both the men lifted up and slammed her onto the ground. Then, they grabbed her by her hair and dragged her across the floor, due to which her clothes were torn. At that moment,

Abhay Kumar Singh pulled out a pistol from his waist and with the intention to kill her, struck her on the head with the butt of the weapon, while others hit her with iron rod, causing her head to split open and bleed heavily. Simultaneously, all of them assaulted his wife with sticks and clubs, causing severe injuries to her left hand and back. When his son, Sabeer Kumar, came to rescue them, all of them together assaulted and injured him as well. Archana Kumari took away the gold mangalsutra worn around my wife's neck. Furthermore, they all threatened them that if they do not give them the pension money, they would kill them. Thereafter, they were taken to the nearest PHC for treatment.

5. Having considered the submission made by the rival of the parties and from perusal of case record it appears that the petitioners named in FIR, the allegation against the petitioners is general and omnibus and some allegations alleged against the individually person involve in this occurrence, but from perusal of the case diary it appears that previously land dispute occurred between the parties and a counter case already been filed by the petitioners side against the informant side vide Minapur P.S. Case No. 191/2026 dated 25.04.2026 on same way and there is no injury report attached in the case diary. Therefore, I am of the view that the petitioners are deserve to anticipatory bail. Therefore, the anticipatory bail of the petitioners is hereby **allowed**.
6. It is hereby directed that in the event of arrest or surrender before the learned Court below within 30 days from the receipt of a copy of this order, the petitioners shall be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/-(rupees ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each with satisfaction of the learned trial court.
