- (1) Heard, learned P.P. for the State and the learned Counsel on behalf of the petitioner/accused Mangla Nand Singh, S/o Late Chandrika Prasad Singh.
- (2) The petitioner is apprehending his arrest under section 482(2) of the BNSS, in connection with Aurai PS Case No. 42/2026, registered under sections 126(2), 127(2), 115(2), 118(1), 109, 303(2), 74, 352, 351(2) of the BNS.
- (3) Ld. counsel for the petitioner submits that no other bail petition either regular or anticipatory has been previously moved either before this court or the Hon'ble High Court, Patna.
- (4) The Ld. Counsel for the petitioner further submits that he is innocent and has been falsely implicated in this case. Ld. Counsel for the petitioner further submits that the allegation levelled against the petitioner is false and concocted and he does not have any criminal antecedent. There is case and counter case between them.
- (5) The case of the informant Rambabu Sah is that when he went to the accused asking for his due amount Rs. 200/-, he was being assaulted by them. Mangla Nand Singh assaulted his father with a rod injuring his head. When his mother came to save him, she too was assaulted and in the process, Rs. 10,000/- was taken out from his father's pocket and mangalsutra was also taken away.
- (6) The learned P.P. for the state opposed the bail petition of the petitioners.
- (7) On perusal of order dated 07.03.2026, it is reflected that prosecution is directed to produce the injury report by the next date. Ld. P.P. for State submits that several reminders have been sent to the concerned P.S. but injury report still not being produced.
- (8) Taking into account the submission made by ld. P.P. for the State and other co-accused persons have already been granted anticipatory bail and the fact that

he is a first time offender and no apprehension is shown on part of the prosecution that the accused would flee from justice or commit a similar offence, if released on bail, in the event of his arrest or surrender in the court concerned within four weeks period from the date of communication of this order, let the above named petitioner be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten thousand) with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned concerned court subject to the following conditions:-

- The petitioner shall co-operate with the investigation agency as well in trial, as and when required.
- The petitioner shall not commit an offence in future.
- The petitioner shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat, or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case.
- The petitioner shall not tamper with the evidence-witness in any manner.
