- (1) Heard, learned P.P. for the State and the learned Counsel on behalf of the petitioners/accused namely, 1. Sajjad Hussain, 2. Ajhar Hussain, 3. Mojahid Hussain, (all sons of Jamal Hussain), 4. Majid Hussain @ Lalu and 5. Jamal Hussain, both sons of Late Noor Mohammad.
- (2) The petitioners are seeking per-arrest bail under section 482(2) of the BNSS, in Sahebganj P.S. Case No. 79 of 2023 registered under sections 341, 323, 307, 406, 420, 504, 506/34 of IPC.
- (3) Ld. counsel for the petitioners submits that no other bail petition either regular or anticipatory has been previously moved before this court or the Hon'ble High Court.
- (4) The Ld. Counsel for the petitioners further submits that petitioners are innocent and have falsely been implicated in this case. It is further alleged that they are of clean antecedent and the entire prosecution story is false and fabricated.
- (5) The case of the informant Md. Shamshad Hussain is that accused Md. Sajjad Hussain had taken Rs. 15 lakh from him on account of increasing his and his brother's business. In this regard, a panchayat was held in which it was decided that Rs. 5 lakh would be paid in three installments, out of which two installments were paid on time and promised to pay remaining Rs.5 lakh within 2-3 months. Thereafter, on 11.03.2023 when he demanded his money, the accused persons abused and assaulted him and took away Rs. 20,000/- along with other documents including blank signed cheques from his shop.
- (6) The learned P.P. for the state opposed the bail petition of the petitioners.
- (7) The informant Shamshad Hussain is present before the court and submits that the matter has been amicably settled between the parties and as such, he no longer wishes to prosecute the matter.

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(8) Taking into account the submission made herein on behalf of the informant and the nature of allegation against the petitioners and also the fact that petitioners are first time offenders and no apprehension is shown on part of the prosecution that the accused would flee from justice or commit a similar offence, if released on bail, in the event of their arrest or surrender in the court concerned within four weeks from the date of communication of this order let the above named petitioners be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten thousand) with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned concerned court subject to the following conditions:-

- The petitioners shall co-operate with the investigation agency, as and when required.
- The Petitioners shall not commit offence in future.
- The petitioners shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat, or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case.
- The petitioners shall not tamper with the evidence-witness in any manner.
