ORDER

01.06.2026 The present bail petition filed on behalf of petitioner, who is in custody in connection with Turki PS Case No. 26/2026 since 17.04.2026.

Heard, learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner and learned P.P. appearing on behalf of the State.

The learned counsel appearing on behalf of the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is innocent and falsely implicated in this case and he has not committed any offence and has two criminal antecedent. It is further submitted that the petitioner not named in F.I.R. and his name came up in the confessional statement of other accused Prince Kumar as per para 35 of the case diary and nothing has been recovered from the possession of the petitioner and he has been rioting in judicial custody since 17.04.2026. Hence prayer for regular bail.

That prosecution story in brief of the informant Dheeraj Kumar stating therein that on 31.01.2026 at 8:30 PM, he was returning from Muzaffapur to his home town in the meantime at Manariya Chowk, three unknown persons committed theft of Motorcycle, A.T.M. card, owner book of vehicles and Rs. 40,000/- from his possession and fled away.

On the other hand, the learned A.P.P. opposed.

Rival contentions of the parties were heard and the record was perused. Perusal of the record which transpires that petitioner not named in FIR, and his name came up in the confessional statement of the co-accused Prince Kumar as mentioned in para-35 of the case diary and nothing has been recovered from his possession and he is in judicial custody for more than one month.

In view of the aforesaid facts and circumstances and also custody period of the accused person. I am of the opinion that the petitioner to grant the privilege of Bail. Hence, the accused petitioner is directed to be released on execution of a bond of Rs. 10,000/-with two sureties of the like amount with satisfaction of the learned trial court.

In the result, this regular bail petition of petitioner namely **Amarjeet Kumar** in connection with Turki P.S. Case No. 26/2026 is hereby **allowed.**
