1. Heard, learned P.P. for the State and the learned Counsel on behalf of the petitioner/accused Ram Shankar Singh, S/o Sitaram Singh.

2. The Petitioner is seeking anticipatory bail under section 438 of the Cr.P.C. apprehending his arrest in Complaint Case No. 2344/2024, registered under section 420 IPC.

3. Ld. counsel for the petitioner submits that no other bail petition either regular or anticipatory has been previously moved before this court or the Hon'ble High Court.

4. The Ld. Counsel for the petitioner submits that he is innocent and has been falsely implicated in concocted case. That petitioner has got no criminal antecedents. Petitioner has already paid Rs. 1,75,000/- to the complainant through cash and online mode and he will also pay rest Rs. 25,000/- to the complainant.

5. Complaint case in brief is that on 05.02.2026, the petitioner had purchased jewellery worth two lakhs rupees from his shop. The petitioner has given two cheques for the same amount but the same was dishonoured by bank. When the complainant demanded his amount, he started to keep evading.

6. The learned P.P. for the state opposed the present anticipatory bail petition.

7. On perusal of record including the complaint petition, it appears that allegation against the petitioner is vague and omnibus in nature. Case is based on complaint petition in which prima facie case has been made out by the court below u/s 420 of the I.P.C., which attracts maximum punishment of not more than seven years. The matter squarely falls under the guideline for grant of bail as propounded by Hon'ble the Supreme Court of India in Satendar Kumar Antil's case. Matter is related to money transaction and it has been submitted on behalf of the petitioner that most of the amount have been returned back through UPI transactions and rest of the amount shall be returned within four months. As per para no.3 of anticipatory bail application the petitioner has got no criminal history.

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Considering the above facts & circumstances and the nature of allegation against the petitioner, the prayer of anticipatory bail is hereby **allowed**. Accordingly, in the event of his arrest or surrender in the court concerned within four weeks from the date of communication of this order, let the petitioner namely, **Ram Shankar Singh, S/o Sitaram Singh** be released on anticipatory bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/-(ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount, to the satisfaction of learned court concerned and subject to the conditions, as laid down u/s 482(2) of the BNSS.
