1. Heard, learned P.P. for the State and the learned Counsel on behalf of the petitioner/accused Sunny Kumar, S/o- Ragho Prasad Singh @ Shashi Bhushan.
2. The Petitioner is seeking regular bail under section 483 of the BNSS, in Kudhani P.S. Case No. 104/2019 registered under sections 341, 323, 304(B), 120(B)/34 of IPC and Sec. 3/4 of Dowry Prohibition Act.
3. The petitioner is in judicial custody since 01.04.2026.
4. Ld. counsel for the petitioner submits that no other bail petition, either regular or anticipatory has been previously moved before this court or the Hon'ble High Court.
5. The Ld. Counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioner is innocent and has not committed any offence. He has been falsely implicated in this case on mere suspicion and instigation of the villagers and the entire story is false and concocted.
6. The learned P.P. for the state opposed the bail petition of the petitioner.
7. The case of informant Vinod Kumar Singh, is that, his daughter Sneha Kumari was married to one Sunny Kumar on 10.12.2018, according to Hindu rites and rituals. However, soon after her marriage, a demand was made for buying a Wagon-R car and on showing her inability to meet the said demand, she was being harassed and tortured by her husband and his family-members. He even tried to convince them, but the accused refused to budge from their stand and said that if he did not give the alleged dowry, they would kill his daughter. He tried to contact his daughter telephonically, but he could not. On 22.02.2019, his daughter was killed by

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her husband and his family. When he reached her sasural, the family had absconded and her body was lying in a room. There was a mark on her neck and there were other signs of assault on her body. He was being told by the neighbours that his daughter was assaulted and killed by her husband and his family-members.

8. Perused the trial court record, the case diary and the postmortem report. The postmortem report mentions cause of death to be Asphyxia, because of antemortem strangulation. Even the inquest report which was prepared in the morning 23.02.2019, around 07.05. a.m., mentions signs of injury on her body, including the neck.
9. Considering the postmortem report, which mentions antemortem strangulation and the seriousness of the crime committed and the punishment provided for the same, this Court is not inclined to grant the benefit of bail to the petitioner. Accordingly, the present bail petition moved on behalf of the petitioner Sunny Kumar stands rejected.
