ORDER

19.06.2026. Instant application for grant of anticipatory bail has been filed on behalf of petitioner named above who apprehends his arrest in connection with Deoria Case No. 13/2022 registered for the offences punishable u/Ss 341, 323, 324, 506, 307, 354(B), 504, 34 of I.P.C.

Heard Mr. Manoj Kumar, learned advocate for the petitioner as well as Ms. Sangita Sahi, learned Addl. P.P. for the State.

Allegation against the petitioner, in brief, is that he along with another co-accused caught informant's hand and misbehave with her, tore her blouse and also held her bosom in the "ganchhi" where informant and her "gotani" had reached at about 4:00 p.m. on 01.02.2022 for attending nature's call.

Specific allegation against the petitioner is that he struck informant with "narkatua" on her head and inflicted her bleeding head injury.

Informant at first was taken to medical hospital for treatment and after returning therefrom, she has lodged this case.

Learned advocate for the petitioner has submitted that petitioner is quite innocent and he has been falsely implicated in this case out of enmity and previous grudge. He has no criminal history and no bail petition has been filed earlier on his behalf before either this court or the Hon'ble High Court, Patna. Allegation against him has been levelled out of village politics and both informant and petitioner are "pattidars". So, he may be granted anticipatory bail.

Learned Addl. P.P. for the State has vehemently opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail.

Perused the certified copy of F.I.R. and copy of case diary.

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Contd..... Having heard learned advocates from both sides and perused the documents
19.06.2026 mentioned above, this court finds that there is delay of about seven days in registering the case and injuries on the person of the informant as per copy case diary received is simple in nature and allegation of misbehaving is omnibus against both the accused-persons.

So, considering the nature of allegation in the F.I.R. against the petitioner and other facts discussed above, this court is inclined to grant petitioner anticipatory bail.

Accordingly, in the event of arrest or surrender within 30 days of passing of this order, petitioner is directed to be released on his furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/-(rupees ten thousand) with two sureties of like amount one of whom shall be his family members, subject to the condition as mentioned U/s 438(2) of Cr.P.C.

Let a copy of this order be forwarded to the concerned court for information & needful.
