- (1) Heard, learned P.P. for the State and the learned Counsel on behalf of the petitioners/accused 1. Surendra Bhagat, S/o Satya Narayan Bhagat 2. Chandrakala Devi, W/o Surendra Bhagat and 3. Upendra Bhagat, S/o Satya Narayan Bhagat.
- (2) The Petitioners are seeking anticipatory bail under section 482(2) of the BNSS apprehending their arrest in Ahiyapur P.S. Case No. 833/2026, registered under section 137(2), 87 BNS.
- (3) Ld. counsel for the petitioners submit that no other bail petition either regular or anticipatory has been previously moved before this court or the Hon'ble High Court.
- (4) Ld. Counsel for the petitioner submits that petitioners are innocent and have been falsely implicated in this case. Petitioners have got no criminal antecedents. Petitioners have not committed any offence as alleged in the F.I.R.
- (5) The case of the informant Lal Babu Sahani is that on 24.04.2026, around 03:00 PM, his daughter went to her friend's place but did not return till evening. Later, he came to know that a boy named Amlesh Kumar has forcibly taken her in a four wheeler car. When he went to his house for inquiring about the same, he was abused and allegedly slapped by the accused persons who happen to be the family members of the boy who kidnapped the girl.
- (6) The learned P.P. for the state opposed the present anticipatory bail petition.
- (7) On perusal of the F.I.R. itself, it is reflected that the petitioners are the parents and family of the co-accused Amlesh Kumar who is said to have ran away with the daughter of the informant. No complicity on their part is shown by the prosecution.

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(8) Looking at the nature of allegation against the petitioners and the fact that they are first time offenders and no apprehension is shown on part of the prosecution that the accused would flee from justice or commit a similar offence, if released on bail, in the event of their arrest or surrender in the court concerned within four weeks from the date of communication of this order, let the above named petitioners be released on furnishing a bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of learned court concerned subject to following conditions:

- The petitioners shall co-operate with the investigating agency as well as in the trial, as and when required.
- The petitioners shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat, or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case.
- The petitioners shall not tamper with the evidence-witness in any manner.
