1. Heard, learned P.P. for the State and the learned Counsel on behalf of the petitioners/accused 1. Chandralok Kumar @ Ritikesh Kumar and 2. Ritik Raushan, both are S/o Om Prakash Bhagat.
2. The Petitioners are seeking regular bail under section 483 of the BNSS, in Kanti P.S. Case No. 307 of 2026, registered under section 126(2), 115, 109, 352, 351(2), 3(5) BNS.
3. The petitioners are in judicial custody since 19.05.2026.
4. Ld. counsel for the petitioners submit that no other bail petition either regular or anticipatory has been previously moved before this court or the Hon'ble High Court.
5. The Ld. Counsel for the petitioners submit that they are innocent and have not committed any offence. Petitioners have got no criminal antecedents. Both the petitioners are grand son of informant and the allegation against them is false and concocted. Ld. Counsel for the petitioners further submit that the matter has been amicably settled between them.
6. The learned P.P. for the state opposed the bail petition of the petitioners.
7. The case of informant, Jagdish Bhagat is that on 18.05.2026, around 06:00 PM, while he was talking to his neighbour, his grand sons Ritik Raushan and Chandralok Kumar attacked him with a rod and a sharp knife. When his daughter-in-law and grand daughter came to his rescue, they too were assaulted. He further alleges that his son Om Prakash Bhagat and his wife Priti Devi too assaulted him.
8. The informant Jagdish Bhagat is present in person alongwith his Ld. Counsel and he submits that the petitioners being his grand sons, misbehaved with him and he does not wish to prosecute the matter, any further. Ld. Counsel for the

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petitioners submit that they undertake not to repeat this act in future and if they do so, their bail bond shall stand cancelled.

9. Looking at the nature of allegation against the petitioner as well as the submissions made by the informant and also the fact that they are first time offender and no apprehension is shown on part of the prosecution that the accused would flee from justice or commit a similar offence, if released on bail, let the above named petitioners be released on furnishing a bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of learned court concerned, subject to following conditions:-

- The petitioners shall co-operate with the investigating agency as well as in the trial, as and when required.
- The petitioners shall not commit an offence in future.
- The petitioners shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat, or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case.
- The petitioners shall not tamper with the evidence-witness in any manner.
