ORDER

1. The above named petitioners seek “Anticipatory Bail” in connection with **Sahebganj P.S. Case No. 432/2022** for offences punishable u/s 341, 323, 324, 307, 504, 506/34 of the IPC and due to apprehension of their arrest in this case. Copy of the same has been served to Ld. Addl.P.P. on behalf of State.
2. The learned counsel for the petitioners has submitted that petitioners are innocent and they have committed no offence. They have been falsely implicated in this case. They have got no criminal antecedents. It has been also submitted that one co-accused Subhash Mishra has been granted regular bail by the Hon’ble High Court in Cr. Misc. No. 19694/2023 vide order dated 19.05.2023 and the case of the petitioners is on better footing. Hence, prayed for anticipatory bail.
3. The Ld. A.P.P. for the State has opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail.
4. That prosecution story in brief is that about 07:00 PM, on 12.08.2022, co-accused Subhash Mishra in intoxicated state arrived at informant’s house and started verbally abusing him. When he protested, petitioners also arrived at his doorstep armed with sticks, lathi and knife to support co-accused Subhash Mishra. All of them together started beating him with lathi and sticks. Meanwhile, co-accused Subhash Mishra, stabbed him in the stomach with a knife with the clear intention to kill him, causing a serious and severe wound. His life was saved due to the timely intervention of the local villagers. Thereafter, his family members immediately brought him to the Maa Janki Hospital, Bairiya, Muzaffarpur for urgent medical treatment.
5. After hearing learned advocates from both sides and perusing the certified copy of F.I.R., T.C.R., this court finds that investigating officer in course of investigation

did not find involvement of these petitioners in the alleged occurrence and thereafter he submitted final form against them. However, learned trial court has taken cognizance also against them. Furthermore, allegation against these petitioners in the F.I.R. is not serious.

So, considering the nature of allegation in the F.I.R. and other facts discussed above, this court is inclined to grant the benefits of Anticipatory Bail to the petitioners.

- 6.** It is hereby directed that in the event of arrest or surrender before the learned Court below within 30 days from the receipt of a copy of this order, the petitioners shall be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/-(rupees ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each with satisfaction of the learned trial court.
