ORDER

10.08.2026

1. The above named petitioner is seeking regular bail in Saraiya P.S. Case No. 410/2025 and he is in custody since 29.05.2026.
2. In terms of previous order, case diary is received by this court.
3. It is submitted by the Ld. counsel for the petitioner that the petitioner is quite innocent and has committed no offence as alleged in FIR. It is further submitted that petitioner has earlier moved for Anticipatory Bail Petition No.- 3218/2025 before Hon'ble Court of District & Sessions Judge- 13th and the same was rejected vide order dated 18.12.2025 then the petitioner filed Cr. Misc. Petition No.- 13766/2026 before Hon'ble High Court, Patna which was rejected vide order dated 23.03.2026 thereafter the petitioner had filed surrender cum bail petition before Id. Court of ACJM- 4th (West) and the same was rejected vide order dated 29.05.2026 and except this no bail petition has ever been filed by the petitioner before any court. It is further submitted that petitioner has no criminal antecedent. It is further submitted that the alleged occurrence, as narrated in the FIR is improbable and unnatural, no specific overt act has been attributed to petitioner and the allegations

against the petitioner are general and omnibus in nature. Lastly, it is submitted that the petitioner is ready to furnish sound sureties, if the petitioner is granted regular bail by this court.

4. On the other hand, the Ld. Addl. P.P. opposed the prayer of the petitioner and submitted that the allegations against the petitioner are grave and serious in nature, therefore, the petitioner does not deserve regular bail at this stage.

Heard and perused the case record.

5. The prosecution case is brief as per written petition given by informant, Ripu Kumar alleging in that on 05.08.2025 at about 8:00 pm, there was a lot of noise at Roshan Kumar's house situated west of my house in his garden. Meanwhile, his father lit a torch in his garden and asked what was the matter, why was there noise. On hearing this, Roshan Kumar, Sudhir Singh, Prince Kumar all three came and started abusing and beating his father. Hearing the noise, he and his brother Rahul Kumar and his mother reached there and they started beating him too. Meanwhile, Prince Kumar, who is of criminal nature and is an accused in many criminal cases and he told to kill Shiv Shankar, on which Roshan Kumar with the intention of killing stabbed his father two-three times in the stomach with the knife in his hand and Prince Kumar stabbed his father on the back. At the time of the incident, Sanjay Singh had held both the hands of his father. When his father fell down due to excessive bleeding and when he told the villagers that you people have killed him, they all ran away knowing dead him. Thereafter, the treatment of his father was done with the help of the villagers who took to CHC Saraiya, where after first aid, seeing his father's critical condition, he was referred to SKMCH, Muzaffarpur, where his treatment started, but seeing his critical condition, they got him admitted to IT Hospital Jhaphan, where the doctor kept him in ICU and his treatment going on.

6. From perusal of case record, it is evident that petitioner is named

in FIR, fardbeyan and Case diary and there is direct and specific allegation against this petitioner that he with the intention of killing informant's father stabbed two-three times in the stomach with knife. The informant supported his case in para 02 of CD. The statement of witnesses in case diary have supported the prosecution case at para no. 05, 06, 07, 34 & 35. As per the Injury Report of the injured namely Shiv Shankar Singh sustained (1) stab injury over left abdomen and left back (2) Pain and bleeding from left lower abdomen. The petitioner stabbed with knife which is a lethal weapon 2-3 times on abdomen which is vital organ. Moreover, in para 70 of case diary, charge-sheet has been submitted against the petitioner.

7. Considering the above facts and circumstances of the case, nature and gravity of accusation and offence, this court is of the view that the instant regular bail petition of the petitioner deserves to be rejected at this stage, accordingly, the instant regular bail petition is hereby **rejected**.
