

A.B.P No. 4367/2025**Deepak Kumar.....Petitioner.****Vs.****State of Bihar..... O.P.****O R D E R****08.04.2026**

This application has been filed, for grant of anticipatory bail, on behalf of the accused petitioner namely, Deepak Kumar, in connection with Ahiyapur P.S. Case No. 616/2025, registered U/Ss 126(2), 115(2), 85, 3(5) of the B.N.S. and ¾ of the D.P. Act, pending in the Ld. court of C.J.M., Muzaffarpur.

Heard arguments of Ld. Counsel, appearing for the accused petitioner, Ld. Counsel for the informant and Ld. A.P.P. for the State.

Ld. Counsel for the accused petitioner, has submitted that previously no anticipatory or regular bail petitions of any nature, had been filed by the accused petitioner, either in this court or before the Hon'ble High Court. That the petitioner has got no criminal history. That the petitioner is quite innocent and has falsely been implicated in this case. That entire allegations as levelled in this case against the petitioner are false and fabricated. That the petitioner is husband of the informant and he has neither demanded anything in dowry from the informant nor from any person related to her and nor he has subjected her to cruelty for the fulfilment of any dowry demand. That there is complete cessation of love and affection between the informant and the petitioner and the petitioner is ready for any amicable settlement. That from facts and circumstances of this case, no offence is made out against the petitioner. It has further been submitted that the petitioner has got genuine apprehension of his arrest in this case. Ld. counsel for the petitioner side, prays for his release on anticipatory bail.

Ld. A.P.P. for the state & Ld. Counsel for the informant, opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail.

Perused the record, including the FIR. Despite repeated directions, the Ld. APP for the state has not submitted updated case diary. From perusal of record, it transpires that allegations against the petitioner are vague, general and omnibus in nature. The present petitioner is husband of the informant and the allegation against the petitioner relate to simple beating and also there is

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matrimonial discord between the husband (petitioner) and wife (informant). Further, allegations of commission of cruelty (with the informant) and demand of dowry have not been corroborated. Matter was referred to mediation centre, but report of failed mediation has been received. All the offences alleged, carry maximum punishment up-to three years and hence the matter squarely falls under the guidelines for grant of bail, issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, in Satender Kumar Antil case. As per para no. 03 of the anticipatory bail application, the petitioner has got no criminal history.

Considering the aforementioned facts and circumstances of the case, including nature of allegations against the accused petitioner, the prayer for anticipatory bail, in respect of him, is hereby **allowed**. Accordingly, in the event of his arrest or surrender within four weeks from today, the accused petitioner, namely, **Deepak Kumar**, is directed to be released on anticipatory bail, on furnishing bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- (Rs. Ten thousands) with two sureties of the like amount, to the satisfaction of the Ld. Court below and subject to the conditions, as laid down u/s 482 (2) of the B.N.S.S. Let a copy of this order be sent to the court concerned, for needful.
