The present application for bail has been filed on behalf of the petitioner, namely, Sanjay Kumar @ Niraj Kumar, who is in judicial custody since 30.06.2025 in connection with Laheri P.S. Case No. 163/2025 registered for the offences punishable under Sections 331(2), 305(a) of the B.N.S.

Heard the learned lawyer for the petitioner as well as the Ld. P.P. for the State.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that petitioner is innocent and has committed no offence and has falsely been dragged and implicated in the present case. Earlier the petitioner has not filed any regular or anticipatory bail either before this learned court or before the Hon'ble High Court. The petitioner has ten criminal antecedents. Learned counsel further submits that the allegation levelled against the petitioner is entirely false, absurd and concocted. The alleged offence has got not applicable against the petitioner. The petitioner is not named accused in the F.I.R. Nothing has been recovered from the house of the petitioner. The petitioner was remanded in this case from Laheri P.S. Case No. 259/2025 on 30.06.2025. The petitioner has not participated in the alleged occurrence. Hence, the petitioner be granted bail.

Ld. P.P. vehemently opposed the prayer for bail of the petitioner by submitting that as per para 69 of the case diary, the petitioner has nine criminal antecedent of almost similar nature.

The prosecution case, in brief, based on the written information of informant Anita Sinha is that house of her mother is situated at Mohalla Patel Nagar, behind the Civil Surgeon Quarter. Her mother is living with her from 3-4 months at Gaya. On 13.04.2025 at 7:00 A.M., she got information from neighbour that lock of house of her mother is in broken condition. On this information, she along with her mother and husband reached at the house of her mother and found that lock of door is broken. Thereafter, they entered into the house and saw that lock of rooms, Godrej and box are broken and articles, which was kept in the Godrej, are scattered. On search, they found that gold chain, gold ring, two pieces of gold Gitiya, Silver Kiya, Silver Payal and Bichhiya and one old Tab of Samsung Company are missing.

Heard the learned lawyer for the petitioner as well as the Ld. P.P. for the State, and perused the case record as well as the case diary from para 1 to para 76. The allegation against the petitioner is that he has committed theft in the house of mother of



the informant. At para 2 of the case diary, there is statement of informant, who has fully supported the case of prosecution. The witnesses at para 6 and 7 of the case diary, have also fully supported the case of prosecution. At para 54 of case diary, the confessional statement of petitioner is mentioned, in which, he has admitted his guilt. There is seizure list attached with the L.C.R., according to the seizure list, total 34 items have been recovered from his house including ornaments. At para 69 of the case diary, it is mentioned that there are nine criminal antecedents against this petitioner while this petitioner in his bail petition at para 3 has mentioned ten criminal antecedents against him. At para 75 of the case diary, charge sheet has already been submitted against the petitioner. It further appears that the petitioner is a habitual offender having ten criminal antecedent of almost similar nature and the learned P.P. has argued that if he is granted bail, he will tamper with the evidence and will again commit the same offence. .

Considering the aforementioned facts and circumstances of this case and the series of criminal antecedent of almost similar nature, this Court is not inclined to grant bail to the petitioner and hence, the same is hereby **rejected**.
