Two separate anticipatory bail petitions, one on behalf of petitioners, namely, **Rosha Devi @ Priti Kumari, Brijnandan Yadav, Guriya Devi and Vijay Yadav** and another on behalf of petitioner, namely, **Premrata Devi and Kiran Devi** have been filed respectively in connection with Gokulpur P.S. Case No. 82/2025 for the offences punishable under Sections 126(2), 115(2), 352, 351(2), 109(1), 329(4), 303(2), 3(5) of B.N.S.

Both the bail petitions are arising from same P.S. Case, hence, both the bail petitions are being decided by a common order.

Heard the learned counsels Mr. Nitish Kumar and Mr. Arun Kumar for the petitioners as well as learned P.P. Sri Anuj Kumar for the State.

Learned counsel for the petitioners in A.B.P. No. 364/2026 submitted that earlier the petitioners have not filed any anticipatory or regular bail petition either before the Court of Sessions or before the Hon'ble High Court, Patna. That the petitioners are innocent, have committed no offence and have falsely been implicated in this case only to save his skin from the counter case i.e. Gokulpur P.S. Case No. 81/2025 which was lodged by Kiran Devi. The petitioners and the informant are agnates and next door neighbor, only to irrigating field there was some scuffle and this case has been registered in wrong notion. There is case and counter case between the parties. That co-accused persons have already been granted bail vide B.P. No. 128/2026 by this Court. That there is no specific overt act has been alleged against the petitioners. He further submitted that both the parties have compromised the matter and they do not want to proceed the case further and hence, a joint compromise petition duly signed by both the parties as well as their respective counsels, has been filed before this Court and a copy of compromise petition is attached with this bail petition. Hence, the petitioners be granted bail.

Learned counsel for the petitioners in A.B.P. No. 424/2026 submitted that earlier the petitioners have not filed any anticipatory or regular bail petition either before the Court of Sessions or before the Hon'ble High Court, Patna. That the petitioners are innocent, have committed no offence and have falsely been implicated in this case only to save his skin from the counter case i.e. Gokulpur P.S. Case No. 81/2025 which was lodged by Kiran Devi. That there is no specific overt act has been alleged against the petitioners. That the petitioners and the informant are agnates and next door neighbor,

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only to irrigating field there was some scuffle and this case has been registered in wrong notion. There is case and counter case between the parties. Further, it is submitted that both the parties have compromised the matter and they do not want to proceed the case further and hence, a joint compromise petition duly signed by both the parties as well as their respective counsels, has been filed before this Court and a compromise petition is attached with this bail petition. Hence, the petitioners be granted bail.

Learned P.P. has conceded that the matter has been compromised between both the parties.

The Prosecution case, in brief, based on the F.I.R. is that while the informant, Rajkishore Yadav stayed in his Sasural at village-Bhathiyar then on 24.12.2025 at about 7:00 AM all the accused persons including the petitioners came armed with various weapons and started abusing the informant and on protest, accused Brijnandan Yadav assaulted Paro Devi with an iron rod on her head causing injury on her head. In the meantime, Dilip Yadav came then accused Vijay Yadav assaulted him on his head causing injury on his head. It is further alleged that Sonu and Monu assaulted Paro Devi and Dilip Yadav with lathi on their body due to which they became unconscious. It is further alleged that all the accused persons entered into the house and took away a gold chain weighing 15 gram, earrings weighing 10 gram and cash Rs. 30,000/- after breaking the lock of the box and they fled away.

Heard the learned counsel for the petitioners as well as the learned P.P. for the State and perused the case record as well as the case diary from para 1 to 78. The allegation against the petitioners is that they along with others assaulted the family members of the informant with various weapons and took away gold chain, earrings and cash Rs. 30,000/-. There is case and counter case between the parties. From perusal of case record, it transpires that the learned lawyers for the petitioners in both bail petitions have filed compromise application that the case has been compromised between the parties.

The informant, Rajkishore Yadav along with his learned counsel also appeared before the Court and said that the matter has been compromised between the parties. He further said that all the accused persons are his relatives so he does not want to continue

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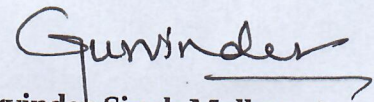
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the case, though some of the sections in the F.I.R. is not compoundable but keeping in mind the factum of compromise and taking a lenient view, this Court is inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioners and, hence the same is hereby **allowed**. In the event of their arrest or surrender, the petitioners are directed to be released on bail before the learned court below within a period of one month from the date of receipt of copy of order in the court concerned on furnishing bail bonds of **Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand)** with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below, subject to the conditions laid down u/s 482(2) of B.N.S.S.
