	10-03-2026	<p>The present petition for regular bail has been filed on behalf of the petitioner Guddu Jamadar @ Guddu Kumar, son of Naresh Jamadar, who is in custody since 02.01.2026 in connection with Chhabilapur P.S. Case No. 33/2023, u/s. 341, 323, 379, 504,506, 498(A), 34 of the IPC and 3/4 D.P. Act.</p> <p>Prosecution case, in brief, is that informant Chandani Kumari gave a complaint petition forwarded by Chief Judicial Magistrate, Bihar Sharif, Nalanda to the S.H.O. of Chhabilapur P.S. alleging therein that on 16.05.2021 she was married to Guddu Jamadar according to Hindu customs. Her parents gave two lakh rupees in cash and other items at the time of wedding. After the wedding, the complainant lived comfortably at her in-law's house for 14-15 days. Her father-in-law, mother-in-law, sister-in-law, brother-in-law unanimously demanded fifty thousand rupees from her parents. The complainant expressed her inability to pay the money. When the demand was not met, her husband, father-in-law, mother-in-law, sister-in-law and brother-in-law began to physically and mentally torture her, treating her like a slave and threatening to force her son to marry another woman. On these facts, Chhabilapur P.S. Case No. 33/2023, dated 02.03.2023 was registered against the petitioner under sections 341, 323, 379, 504,506, 498(A), 34 of the IPC and 3/4 D.P. Act.</p> <p>Heard the learned counsel Shri Anil Kumar for the petitioner as well as learned A.P.P. Shri Sunil Kumar Sinha on behalf of the State.</p> <p>It has been submitted by the learned counsel on behalf of the petitioner that an anticipatory bail application filed prior to this petitioner's case vide A.B.P. No. 1294/2023 has been rejected by this Court and on merit vide order dated 05.01.2024, however the petitioner was subsequently enlarged on bail by the Hon'ble Patna High Court in Criminal Miscellaneous Case No. 15800/2024 vide order dated 29.07.2024 subject to the condition that he shall pay a maintenance amount of Rs. 3,000/- (Three thousand rupees) per month to the Bank account of the informant Chandani Kumar and to deposit the maintenance amount for two consecutive months shall make the accused liable for cancellation of bail. The petitioner is paid only six months maintenance to the informant, i.e. total Rs. 18,000/- and petitioner had stopped paying the maintenance amount in the long time had not been paying the said maintenance amount of Rs. 3,000/- for the past twelve months which is clear violation of the condition imposed by the Hon'ble High Court, Patna. He further submits that petitioner is not able to pay the such amount of Rs. 3,000/- per month because of his economical condition and he has voluntarily surrender before the Lower Court on 02.01.2026 and the petitioner is rotting in jail custody since 02.01.2026. There is no any other cases pending against the petitioner. The petitioner has falsely been implicated in this case due to village politics. In this case, charge has been framed on</p>

On these facts, he has prayed that the petitioner be granted regular bail.</p> <p>Learned A.P.P. vehemently opposed the bail petition.</p> <p>Heard both the parties. Perused the case record, lower court record and relevant papers, it appears that petitioner is the husband of the informant. He has been enlarged on anticipator bail petition by the Hon'ble High Court, Patna vide Cr. Misc No.15800 of 2024 where he undertakes to give Rs. 3,000/- per month to the informant. On the basis of said undertakings in para-iii of the said order, it has been stated that in case, the petitioner fails to deposit the maintenance amount for two consecutive months, the Court below would at liberty to cancel the bail-bond. Petitioner himself admits that he was unable to pay Rs. 3,000/- regularly for last ten months. Ld. counsel for the petitioner further submits that he is still unable to pay the whole amount and further monthly amount, so he has surrender before the Lower Court. The petitioner has disobeyed the order and condition given by the Hon'ble High Court, Patna.</p> <p>On the above facts & circumstances, I am of the view that the said petitioner does not deserve the regular bail.
