Veerabhimaniu Vs. The State of Bihar

The present bail petition has been filed on behalf of petitioner, Veerabhimaniu, who is in judicial custody since 25.01.2026 in connection with Kalyanbigha P.S. Case No. 07/2026 registered for the offences punishable u/s. 305(b) of the B.N.S. 2023.

Heard the learned counsel Sri Barun Kumar for the petitioner as well as learned P.P. Sri Anuj Kumar on behalf of the State.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that earlier, no bail petition either anticipatory or regular has been filed on behalf of petitioner either before this Court or before the Hon'ble High Court, Patna. The petitioner is innocent, has committed no offence and he has falsely been implicated in this case merely on suspicion. The petitioner is not named in the F.I.R. and his name has come in this case during course of investigation simply on suspicion after six days of the occurrence. During course of investigation, the tractor was found on the side of road of Village- Laxmanpur, P.S.- Bakhtiyarpur, Dist- Patna, so the petitioner has no connection either with the stolen article or man of the village of Laxmanpur. The petitioner has been arrested by the Police from his house and nothing has been recovered from his possession. The petitioner has criminal antecedents of two cases in which he is on bail. The petitioner is in judicial custody since 25.01.2026. Hence, the petitioner be granted bail.

Learned P.P. opposed the prayer for bail of the petitioner.

The prosecution case in brief, is that informant Vinit Kumar gave a written petition to the S.H.O. of Kalyanbigha P.S. alleging therein that on 19.01.2026 in the night, his tractor along with the trailer bearing Registration No. BR 01 GM 0645 was parked in the barn(Khalihan) of informant. On 20.01.2026 at about 08:00 A.M., the informant went to his barn and found that his tractor along with the trailer was not there. It is further alleged that it has been taken away by some unknown thieves. On these facts, Kalyanbigha P.S. Case No. 07/2026 was registered against unknown.

Heard the learned lawyer for the petitioner as well as the learned P.P. for the State and perused the case record as well as the case diary from Para 1-104. The allegation against the petitioner is that he has stolen the Tractor of the informant. At Para 2 of the case diary, there is statement of the informant, who has fully supported



the case of the prosecution. Witnesses at Para 6 and 7 of the case diary have also supported the case of the prosecution. From perusal of Para 11 and 12 of the case diary, the Investigating Officer has checked the C.C.T.V. footages and found that two persons on Pulsar bike have stolen the Tractor. Further from perusal of Para 19 and 21 of the case diary, the Police has identified a thief as Veerabhimaniu(the petitioner). From perusal of Para 29 of the case diary, the Police has recovered the stolen tractor, even the I.O, has checked the tower locations of the petitioner, at the time of occurrence, the petitioner was present at the place of occurrence. At Para 79 of the case diary, there are 03 criminal antecedents of this petitioner. The petitioner is in custody from 25.01.2026, that is for almost 02 months.

Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of this case, and also keeping in mind the period of custody of the petitioner, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner and hence, the same is hereby **allowed**. The petitioner is directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bonds of **Rs. 10,000/-** with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below.
