	06-05-2026	<p>The anticipatory bail petition dated 06.03.2026 received to this Court on 13.03.2026 filed on behalf of the petitioner, namely, Satish Jamadar who is apprehending his arrest in connection with Noorsarai P.S. Case No. 34/2026 registered u/s 126(2),115(2), 351(2), 352, 109, 117(2), 3(5) of the B.N.S., has been placed before me for order after hearing, a copy of it has already been supplied to the learned Addl.P.P.</p> <p>Heard the learned counsel Sri Gaya Prasad for the petitioner as well as the learned Addl.P.P. Sri Amir Singh on behalf of the State.</p> <p>The prosecution story as per the written report of the informant Raj Balam Jamadar, in brief, is that on 24.01.2026 at about 14:30 hours the accused Chunnu Jamadar, Satish Jamadar, Neetu Devi and Jagiya Devi came and started assaulting at his head with iron rod due to which he became unconscious and fell down. The accused persons fled away giving threatening presuming him dead.</p> <p>The learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner is innocent and has been falsely implicated in this case due to old enmity. According to FIR there is general and omnibus allegation against the petitioner. The counter case is running between the informant and petitioner from previously. The petitioner is having one criminal antecedent as Noorsarai P.S. Case No. 528/25. On these facts, he prayed that the petitioner be granted anticipatory bail.</p> <p>The learned Addl.P.P. opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail.</p> <p>Having gone through the case record, it appears that there is no specific allegation against the petitioner. Also, the injury report as incorporated in para-33 of the case diary reflects that the injury of the informant is simple in nature caused by hard and blunt substance.</p> <p>Thus, considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, petitioner, namely, Satish Jamadar is directed to be admitted on anticipatory bail on furnishing his bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned trial Court within one month from the communication of this order subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 482 B.N.S.S. with further condition that the petitioner will remain physically present on each and every date till framing of charge.</p> <p align="right">Dictated & corrected Sd/- (Khyati Singh) Addl.
