	30-04-2026	<p>The anticipatory bail petition dated 09.03.2026 received to this Court on 11.03.2026 filed on behalf of the petitioners, namely, (1) Anuj Kumar and (2) Rahul Kumar, who are apprehending their arrest in connection with Noorsarai P.S. Case No. 668/2025 registered u/s 126(2), 115(2), 127(2), 118(2), 109, 351,(2), 190, 61(2), 191(2), 352 of the B.N.S., has been placed before me for order after hearing, a copy of it has already been supplied to the learned Addl.P.P.</p> <p>Heard the learned counsel Sri Kamlesh Kumar for the petitioners as well as the learned Addl.P.P. Sri Amir Singh on behalf of the State.</p> <p>The prosecution story as per the written report of the informant Radha Devi, in brief, is that on 24.12.2025 her husband Chandan Kumar, Shivdani Yadav and Shivnath Kumar went to meet the Noorsarai C.O. While they were returning from Noorsarai Police Station after submitting an application, several accused persons, namely, Guddu Yadav, Vinod Yadav, Harkhit Yadav, Dharmendra Kumar, Alok Kumar, Rupesh Kumar, Dhanraj Kumar, Rahul Kumar and Anuj Kumar, were already present near the gate of the police station. On seeing them, the informant and his companions boarded a bus to return to Bihar Sharif. When the bus reached near the gate of Bazar Samiti, Bihar Sharif, the accused persons intercepted the bus and, identifying Chandan Kumar and Shivdani Yadav inside the bus, forcibly boarded the bus armed with iron rods and country-made pistol. They allegedly dragged both victims out of the bus and took them to a secluded place where they assaulted them mercilessly with rods and sticks with the intention to kill, causing grievous injuries including fracture of both legs. Some of the accused threatened the victims to face dire consequences if they would disclose their names and also threatened the informant and others. Subsequently, at about 3:30 PM, both injured persons were found lying beside the road near Balaji Petrol Pump in a critical condition. The police took them to Sadar Hospital for treatment.</p> <p>The learned counsel for the petitioners has submitted that the petitioners are innocent and have committed no offence rather they have falsely been dragged and implicated in this case due to local party politics. The whole prosecution story is false, baseless and concocted. There is no specific allegation against the petitioners. Also, the present case is counter blast of Noorsarai P.S. Case No. 666/25 which has been lodged by the brother of the petitioner Rupesh Kumar against the informant's relatives. He further submitted that the victim Chandan Kumar and Shivdani Yadav had sustained injuries in a road accident in drunken state and due to previous enmity the petitioners have been made accused in this case. On these facts, he prayed that the petitioners be granted anticipatory bail.</p> <p>The learned Addl. P.P. opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail.</p> <p>Having gone through the case record, it appears that there is no specific allegation against the petitioners. Also, the injury report of the victims as incorporated in the case diary reflect that the injury is simple in nature caused by hard and blunt object. The previous land dispute between the parties is admitted. Also, there is a case and counter case between the parties in which both the parties got injured. Further, the other co-accused persons have already been granted bail by the Court of learned Additional Sessions Judge-1st, BiharSharif.</p> <p>Thus, considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, the petitioners, namely, (1) Anuj Kumar and (2) Rahul Kumar are directed to be admitted on anticipatory bail on furnishing their bail bonds of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned trial Court within one month from the communication of this order subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 482 B.N.S.S..</p> <p style="text-align: right;">Dictated & corrected Sd/- (Khyati Singh) Addl.
