1. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner, Sukali Devi @ Gorki, who is in judicial custody since 12.04.2026 in connection with Chhabilapur P.S. Case No. 214/2025 registered u/s 103(1), 238, 3(5) of the B.N.S. Also heard learned P.P. for the State.

2. Prosecution case, in short, is that on 27.11.2025, husband of the informant has gone to irrigate the field and he did not return to his house. After hectic search, no trace was found of her husband. On 01.12.2025 at about 12:00 'O' clock, one villager went near boring and found lock of cabin was opened. He opened the door and found one person dead, hanging with Bamboo. On his Hulla, the informant and others went there and saw the dead-body of her husband. The informant further alleged that her husband and the co-accused Awadhesh Yadav were in company of each other. Her husband had kept Rs. 65,000/- after selling paddy crop. Her husband had gone to the house of petitioner Sukli Devi @ Gorki along with the co-accused Awadhesh Yadav and other two co-accused persons were present there from before. The informant claimed that the petitioner and three co-accused persons have committed the occurrence.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner has not moved any bail application either regular or anticipatory in this court or any superior court prior to this bail application. The petitioner has no criminal antecedent. Learned counsel further submits that the petitioner is innocent and has been dragged and implicated in this present case due to village politics. The allegation against the petitioner is not specific rather it is vague and omnibus. The petitioner is not involved in this case. Hence, the petitioner be granted bail.

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4. On the other hand, Learned P.P. opposed the prayer for bail.
5. Perused the case record. As per allegation, the petitioner and 3 co-accused persons committed murder of the husband of the informant. The dead-body was found in a cabin near boring. The witnesses, in case diary, have supported the prosecution version. From para 35 and 36 of the case diary, it appears that there had been five mobile calls between the deceased and the petitioner and there had also been 54 mobile calls between the co-accused, Awadhesh Yadav, and the petitioner, Sukli Devi @ Gorki. The case is under investigation. The statement made in para 3 of the bail petition that the petitioner has no criminal antecedent.
6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances and the nature of allegation, this court is not inclined to grant bail to the petitioner. Hence, the prayer for bail of the petitioner, Sukali Devi @ Gorki, is hereby **rejected**.
