The present application for regular bail has been filed on behalf of the petitioner, namely, Amarnath Verman @ Amarnath Verma, who is in judicial custody since 03.05.2026, in connection with Deepnagar P.S. Case No. 193/2026 registered for the offences punishable under Sections 304(2), 317(2), 112(2), 3(5) of the B.N.S., 2023.

Heard the learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned P.P. for the State.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that earlier no bail petition either regular or anticipatory on behalf of the petitioner has been filed either before the Court of Sessions or before the Hon'ble High Court, Patna. It is further submitted that the petitioner is innocent, has committed no offence and has falsely been implicated in this case. That the prosecution case is totally false, concocted and baseless and there is no iota of truth in it. That the petitioner is not named in the F.I.R. rather the name of the petitioner has transpired only on confessional statement of co-accused. That the petitioner is the proprietor of Mayur Jewelers situated at Deepnagar and as a matter of fact the petitioner has never purchased the stolen locket from the co-accused and the police cooked up a false story. That there is no criminal antecedent against the petitioner as mentioned in para 3 of the bail petition and he is in judicial custody since 03.05.2026 in this case. It is next submitted that the petitioner is a man of means and substance as such there is no chance of his absconding from the case and is ready to furnish the substantial sureties to the satisfaction of the Court. Based on above submissions, he has prayed that the petitioner be granted bail.

Learned P.P. for the State opposed the prayer for bail of the petitioner.

The prosecution case, in brief, is that on 15.04.2026, the informant, Nitu Devi submitted a written report before Deepnagar P.S. alleging therein that at about 11:00 A.M., she boarded a toto at Devisarai for proceeding to village-Tungi to attend a marriage ceremony. While she was travelling between Devisarai and Mangla Asthan, two unknown persons riding a motorcycle intercepted the vehicle and snatched her gold mangalsutra weighing 5.5 grams and fled away. It is further alleged that despite the informant's request, the toto driver neither stopped the vehicle nor attempted to chase the miscreants, giving rise to a suspicion that he was acting in connivance with them. The toto driver was identified as Nitish Kumar. On the basis of the aforesaid allegations, the present case was instituted against the said Nitish Kumar and two unknown persons for their alleged involvement in the occurrence.

Heard the learned counsel for the petitioner as well as the learned P.P. for the State and perused the case record as well as the case diary from para 1 to 103. The petitioner is not named in the F.I.R. which was registered against the toto driver and two unknown.

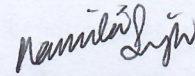

The name of the petitioner has come up during investigation on the basis of confessional statement of co-accused. He is alleged to be the buyer of stolen mangalsutra. Nothing has been recovered from the possession of the petitioner and as per para 83 of the case diary some melted gold has been produced by his family members. Para 56 reveals that he has clean antecedent. He is in custody since 03.05.2026. Under the particular facts his continued incarceration does not appear necessary.

Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of this case, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner and hence, the same is hereby **allowed**.

The petitioner is directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bonds of **Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand) with two sureties** of like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below.
