Ramsiya Singh Vs. The State of Bihar

The present petition for anticipatory bail has been filed on behalf of petitioner, Ramsiya Singh, who is apprehending his arrest in connection with Gokhulpur P.S. Case No. 27/2026 registered for the offences punishable u/s. 109(1) of the B.N.S. 2023.

Learned lawyer of the petitioner has submitted that earlier, no bail petition either anticipatory or regular has been filed on behalf of the petitioner either before this Court or the Hon'ble High Court. He further submitted that the petitioner is innocent, has committed no offence and he has falsely been dragged and implicated in the present case by the informant due to land dispute and previous enmity. As per F.I.R., neither any deadly weapon has been used in the whole occurrence nor any repetition of assault has been alleged. In this case, Section 109(1) of the B.N.S. 2023 is not applicable. The petitioner has no criminal antecedent. Hence, the petitioner be granted anticipatory bail.

Learned P.P. opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail of the petitioner.

Prosecution case, in brief, is that informant Ravindra Singh gave a written petition to the S.H.O. of Gokhulpur P.S. alleging therein that the petitioner Ramsiya Singh was digging up a boring in the Survey Gali, then the informant said the petitioner to get the measurement done by the Government Surveyor, then do the boring. As soon as, he said this, the petitioner Ramsiya Singh hit the informant on his head by iron Khanti with intent to kill him due to which he sustained injury on his head. It is further alleged that if the others people had not intervened, the petitioner would kill him. The brother of the informant, nephew of the informant and others villagers have seen the occurrence. On these facts, Gokhulpur P.S. Case No. 27/2026 was registered against the petitioner.

Heard the learned lawyer for the petitioner as well as the learned P.P. for the State and perused the case record as well as the case diary. No doubt there is specific allegation against the petitioner of assaulting the informant on his head with a Khanti with murderous intent and injuring him. However, the injury report in Para 52 of the Case Diary reveals a single abrasion injury of simple nature. As per Para 97, the petitioner has clean antecedent.

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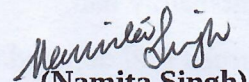

Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of this case, this Court finds it a fit case to grant anticipatory bail, accordingly, the petitioner is **granted** anticipatory bail. It is further ordered that the petitioner is directed to be released on bail in the event of his arrest or surrender whichever is earlier within a period of 30 days from the date of receipt of the copy of order in the court concerned, on furnishing bail bond of **Rs. 10,000/-** with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below subject to the conditions as laid down u/s 482(2) of the B.N.S.S. along with further condition that **the petitioner shall present himself before the Investigating Officer for interrogation as and when required and shall co-operate in investigation.**
