1. Heard learned counsel for the petitioners Suruti Devi, Tukiya Devi @ Punam Devi and Priyanka Devi, who are in judicial custody since 26.04.2026 in connection with Noorsarai P.S. Case No. 248/2026 registered u/s 318(4), 303(2), 3(5) of the B.N.S. 2023. Also heard learned P.P. for the State.

2. Prosecution case, in short, is that the informant Meena Kumari submitted her written report, alleging therein that on 25.04.2026, she was traveling in a Tempo vehicle. Three women also sat in the vehicle. They got down from the vehicle. In the meantime, the informant saw that chain of her bag was opened and her purse containing some gold, silver ornaments and Rs. 1200/- were missing. When she made alarm, then three women threw purse of the informant and they were apprehended after coming Police. One artificial ornament and Rs. 60/- were recovered from three women. Accordingly, the case was registered against the petitioners.

3. Learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that earlier, no bail petition either anticipatory or regular has been filed on behalf of petitioners either before this Court or before the Hon'ble High Court, Patna. The petitioners have no criminal antecedent. The petitioners are innocent, have committed no offence and they have falsely been implicated in the present case. The real fact is that the child of the petitioner in her arms urinated, which fell on the informant's belongings, resulted unnecessary conversation took place between the informant and the petitioners. Seizure list was not prepared on the spot and there is no independent witness. There is no recovery of articles in Police

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presence rather the articles were produced by the informant herself. The confession before the Police has no value in the eye of law. The allegation of theft is super addition. The petitioners are ladies and they are in custody since 26.04.2026. Hence, the petitioners be granted bail.

4. On the other hand, Learned P.P. opposed the prayer for bail.

5. Perused the case record. As per allegation, the petitioners committed theft of purse of the informant containing some gold and silver ornaments and Rs. 1200/-, during course of traveling in a Tempo. The petitioners are in custody since 26.04.2026. Statement has been made in Para 3 of the bail petition that the petitioners have no criminal antecedent.

6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of this case, nature of allegation and detention period of the petitioners in custody, the petitioners Suruti Devi, Tukiya Devi @ Punam Devi and Priyanka Devi are hereby directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bonds of **Rs. 10,000/-** with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court concerned.
