Ritik Kumar @ Raushan Kumar Vs. The State of Bihar

The present application for regular bail has been filed on behalf of the petitioner, namely, **Ritik Kumar @ Raushan Kumar**, who is in judicial custody since 01.05.2026, in connection with Laheri P.S. Case No. 190/2026 registered for the offences punishable under Section 305(a) of the B.N.S., 2023.

Heard the learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned P.P. for the State.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that earlier no bail petition either regular or anticipatory on behalf of the petitioner has been filed either before the Court of Sessions or before the Hon'ble High Court, Patna. It is further submitted that the petitioner is a scrap dealer who is innocent, has committed no offence rather he has falsely been implicated in this case due to previous enmity with malafide intention with a view to humiliate and harass him and also with a view to lower down his prestige in the eyes of local people. That there is no attribution of specific allegation against the petitioner. That there is no criminal antecedent against the petitioner as mentioned in para 3 of the bail petition and he is in judicial custody since 03.05.2026 in this case. It is next submitted that the petitioner is ready to furnish the substantial sureties to the satisfaction of the Court. That the petitioner further undertakes that here will be no misuse on his part and he will make himself always available when and where he will be required by the court or police. Based on above submissions, he has prayed that the petitioner be granted bail.

Learned P.P. for the State opposed the prayer for bail of the petitioner.

The prosecution case, in brief, based on the written information of the informant, namely, Raju Kumar is that on 30.04.2026 at 2:00 PM, Ritik Kumar, Budhan Paswan along with one unknown person were cutting the water supply pipe made of iron of the informant. When the informant opened the door of his house then all these three persons started running away but one of them got caught and remaining two persons fled away. Thereafter, the informant informed the police and the apprehended person handed over to the police. On the basis of written report, the S.H.O. of Laheri P.S. registered the case as Laheri P.S. Case No.190/2026 under section 305(a) of the B.N.S.

Heard the learned counsel for the petitioner as well as the learned P.P. for the State and perused the case record. The case diary was called for on 20.05.2026 but has not been received as yet. The petitioner is in custody since 01.05.2026 so order is being passed on the basis of material available on record. The allegation against the petitioner is of attempting to steal a water pipe. He has been caught by the informant and produced before the police. He is in custody since 01.05.2026 and has claimed to have clean antecedent.

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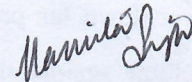

Considering the facts and circumstances of this case and the period of custody undergone, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner. Accordingly, the same is hereby **allowed**, subject to the conditions that the petitioner shall co-operate with the investigation, appear before the investigating officer as and when required, and file an undertaking regarding his claim of clean antecedent.

The petitioner is directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bonds of **Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand) with two sureties** of like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below.
