	15-07-2026	The anticipatory bail petition dated 21.05.2026 received to this Court on 25.05.2026 filed on behalf of petitioner Pintu Kewat who is apprehending his arrest in connection with Mahila P.S. Case No. 143/2025 instituted for the offences punishable under Sections 126(2), 115(2), 85, 352, 351(2), 3(5) of the B.N.S., has been placed before me for order after hearing, a copy of it has already been supplied to the learned P.P. Heard the learned counsel Mr. Syed Iftexhar Ahmad for petitioners as well as learned P.P. Mr. Anuj Kumar on behalf of the State. The prosecution story as per the typed report of informant Sanjuli Devi, in brief, is that she was married to accused Pintu Kewat about ten years ago in accordance with Hindu rites and rituals. At the time of marriage, cash and gold ornaments etc. were given by her father as gift. Out of the wedlock, three children were born. After few years of marriage her husband Pintu Kewat, mother-in-law Meena Devi, and father-in-law Ram Pravesh Kewat, started torturing her for demand of ₹50,000/-. The informant was allegedly assaulted and driven out of her matrimonial home on account of non-fulfilment of the said demand. Further, it is alleged that the accused persons forcibly took away her children and extended threats of dire consequences, including threats to life, to the informant and her father. The learned counsel for the petitioner has submitted that petitioner is innocent and has committed no offence rather he has falsely been dragged and implicated in the present case. He also submits that the petitioner is ready to keep his wife with full honour and dignity. Further, the petitioner has got no any criminal antecedent. On these facts, he prayed that petitioner be granted anticipatory bail. The learned P.P. opposed the prayer for anticipatory bail. Having gone through the case record, it transpires that the petitioner is the husband of the informant. It has been submitted on behalf of the petitioner that the petitioner is ready to keep his wife with full honour and dignity. The record further reflects that the notice was sent to the informant by this Court but she did not appear before the Court though she had received the notice on 24.06.2026. Moreover, the alleged offences are punishable for less than seven years.	

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	Contd... 15-07-2026	Thus, considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case, petitioner Pintu Kewat is directed to be admitted on anticipatory bail on furnishing his bail bond of Rs. 10,000/- with two sureties of like amount each to the satification of the learned trial Court within one month from the communication of this order subject to the conditions as laid down under Section 482 B.N.S.S..
