Ajay Kumar Vs. The State of Bihar

The present application for regular bail has been filed on behalf of the petitioner, namely, **Ajay Kumar**, who is in judicial custody since 16.05.2026, in connection with Manpur P.S. Case No. 93/2026 registered for the offences punishable under Sections 137(2), 87 of the B.N.S., 2023.

Heard the learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned P.P. for the State.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that earlier no bail petition either regular or anticipatory on behalf of the petitioner has been filed either before the Court of Sessions or before the Hon'ble High Court, Patna. It is further submitted that the petitioner is innocent, has committed no offence and has falsely been implicated in this case only on suspicion. That the prosecution case is totally false, concocted and baseless and there is no iota of truth in it. That the victim is an adult woman and it is a matter of love affairs between the petitioner and the victim. That there is no criminal antecedent against the petitioner as mentioned in para 3 of the bail petition and he is in judicial custody since 16.05.2026. It is next submitted that the petitioner is a man of means and substance as such there is no chance of his absconding from the case and is ready to furnish the substantial sureties to the satisfaction of the Court. Based on above submissions, he has prayed that the petitioner be granted bail.

Learned P.P. for the State opposed the prayer for bail of the petitioner.

The prosecution case, in brief, based on the written information of the informant, Rajiv Kumar is that on 06.05.2026 at about 11:00 PM, the informant's wife aged about 19 years, left her house along with her son for going to her maternal home and could not be traced thereafter. Despite diligent search by the family members and relatives, her whereabouts remained unknown. During search, it came to light that the victim was in contact with one Ajay Kumar who is the co-villager of the informant through mobile phones and was allegedly enticed and taken away by him. It is further alleged that the accused established communication with the victim and induced her to leave her parental home. On the basis of the written report, the F.I.R. was registered and investigation was taken up.

Heard the learned counsel for the petitioner as well as the learned P.P. for the State and perused the case record as well as the case diary from para 1 to 66. The petitioner is in custody since 16.05.2026. The victim woman has been recovered. Her statement u/s 183 B.N.S.S. has been recorded and after perusal of the same it appears that she is major and has stated to have voluntarily eloped with the petitioner.

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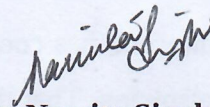
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Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of this case, this Court is inclined to grant bail to the petitioner and hence, the same is hereby **allowed**.

The petitioner is directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bonds of **Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand)** with two sureties of like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below.
