1. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner, namely, Biresh Manjhi, who is in judicial custody since 17.04.2026 in connection with Nalanda P.S. Case No. 81/2026 registered under Section 103(1) of the B.N.S. Also heard learned P.P. for the State.

2. Prosecution case, in short, is that the informant Jalo Devi got recorded her fardbeyan alleging therein that on 12.04.2026 at about 5:00 P.M., her husband was abusing her on some family issues. Hearing this, the petitioner perceived that he was being abused and he started assaulting husband of the informant. He assaulted husband of the informant with a big brick upon his head and naval causing him fully injured. On the same day at about 8:00 P.M., husband of the informant felt severe pain in his stomach and at about 9:00 P.M., he died. The informant claimed that her husband died to assault by the petitioner.

3. Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that earlier, no bail petition either regular or anticipatory on behalf of the petitioner has been filed either before the Court of Sessions or before the Hon'ble High Court, Patna. There is two criminal antecedent against the petitioner. Learned counsel further submits that the petitioner is innocent, has committed no offence and he has falsely been implicated in this case due village politics. The petitioner had no intention to kill the deceased. Based on above submissions, he has prayed that the petitioner be granted bail.

4. On the other hand, Ld. P.P. opposed the prayer for bail of the petitioner and he submits that there is direct allegation of committing murder of the deceased against the petitioner. He further submits that charge sheet has been submitted u/s 103(1) of the B.N.S.

5. Perused the case record. As per allegation, the petitioner committed murder of husband of the informant by assaulting him with a big brick. Witnesses in case diary, have supported the prosecution version. Charge sheet has been submitted u/s 103(1) of the B.N.S. and accordingly, cognizance has been taken. Statement has been made in Para 03 of the bail

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petition that the petitioner is also accused in two other cases.

6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of the case and nature of allegation, this Court is not inclined to grant bail to the petitioner. Accordingly, the prayer for bail of the petitioner, Biresh Manjhi, is hereby **rejected**.
