1. Heard learned counsel for the petitioner, namely, Rajkumar Yadav @ Raj Kumar who is in judicial custody since 01.06.2026 in connection with Manpur P.S. Case No. 110/2026 registered under Sections 191(2), 191(3), 190, 49, 115(2), 126(2), 352, 351(2), 109(1), 196(1) of B.N.S. Also heard learned P.P. for the State.

2. Prosecution case, in short, is that on 30.05.2026, the informant, police officer along with his team reached at village-Peduka near Bagicha in pursuance to information received. They found that the boys of two communities were quarrelling. It is alleged that boys in the age group of 20 to 25 years were assaulting each other. On enquiry from the villagers, it transpired that the boys of two communities had earlier been playing cricket in the field, and over an issue relating to water and cold drinks, they assaulted each other. In the meantime, family members of the boys of both communities also started assaulting each other with stone, lathi and danda. Members from both side sustained injuries. Thereafter, on arrival of the police force from the other police station, the situation was brought under control. It is further alleged that the injured persons, namely, Gaura Devi, Rajkumar Yadav and Mangal Kumar were sent for treatment. No person from other side was found injured. Accordingly, the case was registered against 16 F.I.R. named accused persons, including the petitioner.

3. Learned counsel appearing for the petitioner submitted that earlier no bail petition either regular or anticipatory on behalf of the petitioner has been filed either before the Court of Sessions or before the Hon'ble High Court, Patna. Petitioner is innocent, has committed no offence and has falsely been implicated in the present case. From perusal of F.I.R., it is apparent that the boys were used to play cricket in the field and on the alleged date of occurrence, the quarrel took place between the boys on the issue of taking water and could drink from a nearby *gumti*. Admittedly, no word of promoting enmity was used and nothing

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occurred on the basis of religion or two different communities and as such the offence u/s 196(1) has got no application in the case. From perusal of F.I.R., it further transpires that the petitioner is himself an injured person and there is no allegation that he committed any overt act to anybody. Petitioner is a student of graduation and he himself is a victim of unfortunate circumstances. Petitioner has no criminal antecedent as mentioned in para 3 of the bail petition and he is in custody since 01.06.2026. Petitioner undertakes to co-operate in the investigation and trial. Petitioner is ready to furnish bailors and sureties for his release on bail. Based on above submissions, he has prayed that the petitioner be granted bail.

4. The Ld. P.P. for the State opposed the prayer for bail of the petitioner.

5. Perused the case record. As per allegation persons of two communities including the petitioner assaulted each other with stone, lathi and danda. There is no specific allegation of assault against the petitioner. Despite giving sufficient opportunities, learned P.P. has produced one injury report, which reveals that the injuries were sustained by the petitioner, Rajkumar Yadav @ Raj Kumar. The petitioner is in custody since 01.06.2026. Statement has been made in para 3 of the bail petition that petitioner has no criminal antecedent.

6. Considering the aforesaid facts and circumstances of this case and detention period of the petitioner in custody, the petitioner, Rajkumar Yadav @ Raj Kumar is hereby directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail bonds of **Rs. 10,000/-(Rupees Ten Thousand) with two sureties** of like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court concerned.
