This anticipatory bail petition has been filed on behalf of the petitioners 1.Dipu Kumar and 2.Amar Kumar @ Amar Prasad Yadav who are apprehending their arrest in connection with Akbarpur P.S. Case No.260 of 2025 u/ss. 140(3) and 3(5) of the B.N.S and put up for hearing.</p> <p>2. Heard Shri Avinash Chandra, learned counsel for the petitioners as well as Shri Manoj Kumar Singh, learned P.P. for the State assisted by Shri Rajesh Kumar, learned counsel for the informant. Perused the record including the case diary.</p> <p>3. The short case of the prosecution as per the written statement of the informant Ravindra Prasad Yadav is that on 14.05.2025 at about 03:00 P.M. her daughter went for shopping at Fatehpur market but she could not return her maternal grand-father's house. submitted that the petitioners have no criminal antecedent. It has been submitted that petitioners are innocent and they have falsely been implicated in the present case. It has further been submitted that no one has kidnapped the daughter of the informant. It has also submitted that informant's daughter married with the petitioner no.1, Dipu Kumar with her consent and both of them are living happily as husband and wife. It has further submitted that the is general and omnibus allegation against these petitioners. Hence, anticipatory bail petition of the petitioners may be allowed.

On the contrary learned P.P. assisted by learned counsel for the informant opposed the anticipatory bail petition of the petitioners.

5. Petitioners, namely, Dipu Kumar and Aman Kumar are alleged to have kidnapped the daughter of the informant, namely, Sima Kumari. The victim is present before this Court along with a child and she stated that no one kidnapped her. She has got married with the accused-Dipu Kumar and has a child. Further, the victim is the age of 26 years old. She herself is major and the petitioner-Dipu Kumar is also major one. Both the persons have solemnized their marriage with their own consent, which is not a criminal in act. Both are consenting party and are major. Petitioners

have no criminal antecedent.

6. In view of the above, this court thinks it fit just, proper and legal to admit the petitioners on anticipatory bail. Accordingly, the prayer for anticipatory bail of the accused-petitioners 1.Dipu Kumar and 2.Amar Kumar @ Amar Prasad Yadav are being **allowed** hereby and it is ordered that in the event of surrender/arrest within four weeks from today the petitioners shall be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/- (Ten thousand) each with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below subject to the conditions as laid down u/s 482(2) of the B.N.S.S. with further conditions that the petitioners shall make themselves available for interrogation by a police officer as and when required and the petitioners shall not, directly or indirectly, make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade them from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer, the petitioners shall remain present on each and every date during the trial and if the petitioners fail to appear on two consecutive dates their bail-bonds shall be liable to be cancelled.
