This anticipatory bail petition has been filed on behalf of the petitioners, namely, 1.Suman Kumar, 2.Sonu Kumar and 3.Kanti Devi who are apprehending their arrest in connection with Thali P.S. Case No.23 of 2026 u/ss. 126(2), 115(2), 109, 352, 351(2), 303(2) and 3(5) of the B.N.S and put up for hearing. 2. Heard Shri Arvind Kumar, learned counsel for the petitioners as well as Shri Manoj Kumar Singh, learned P.P. for the State. Perused the record including the case diary. 3. The short case of the prosecution as per the written statement of the informant Dinesh Yadav is that on 09.02.2026 the accused Suman Kumar was constructing guide-wall in the land of the informant and on getting knowledge about the same, sister of the informant Guriya Devi objected then Sonu Kumar came and abused and assaulted her by means of spade. It is alleged that when other sister namely Rinku Devi and wife Nilam Devi came to save her, they assaulted them by means of rod, etc. It is also alleged that accused Sonu Kumar snatched Gold chain from the neck of Guriya Devi.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that the petitioner no.1 and 2 are accused in Govindpur P.S. Case No.41 of 2022 under Section 341, 354(c), 504/34 of IPC and 3(i)(r)(s) of SC/ST Act, in which they are on bail, whereas, petitioner no.3 has no criminal antecedent. It has been submitted that petitioners are innocent and they have falsely been implicated in the present case. It has further been submitted that the allegation as regard to assault is general and omnibus in nature against. Hence, anticipatory bail petition of the petitioners may be allowed.

On the contrary learned P.P. opposed the anticipatory bail petition of the petitioners.

5. The petitioner no.1 and 2 are accused in Govindpur P.S. Case No.41 of 2022 under Section 341, 354(c), 504/34 of IPC and 3(i)(r)(s) of SC/ST Act, in which they are on bail, whereas, petitioner no.3 has no criminal antecedent From the body of the FIR, the informant states that Sonu Kumar assaulted his Sister-Guriya Devi with spade whereas from the perusal of the case diary, eye-witnesses in para 6 and 7 of the case diary clearly stated that Guriya Devi was assaulted by Suman Kumar, petitioner no.1 by stick, which shows how embellishment is made in the FIR. Further, both the eye-witnesses have stated that there is land dispute between the

parties over which the said altercation occurred. The injury report has been brought on record which shows Gudiya Devi has swelling on right forearm, swelling and tenderness in left lower leg and thigh. Swelling and tenderness on the right lower leg. The X-ray report has been taken which shows to be normal. The injury report was found to be simple in nature.

6. In view of the above, this court thinks it fit just, proper and legal to admit the petitioners on anticipatory bail. Accordingly, the prayer for anticipatory bail of the accused-petitioners, namely, 1.Suman Kumar, 2.Sonu Kumar and 3.Kanti Devi are being **allowed** hereby and it is ordered that in the event of surrender/arrest within four weeks from today the petitioners shall be released on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/- (Ten thousand) each with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below subject to the conditions as laid down u/s 482(2) of the B.N.S.S. with further conditions that the petitioners shall make themselves available for interrogation by a police officer as and when required and the petitioners shall not, directly or indirectly, make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any
