26.03.2026	<p>This bail petition has been filed on behalf of the petitioner Navin Kumar, who is in custody since 16.02.2026 in connection with Nawada Town P.S. Case No. 195 of 2026 u/s 319(2), 318(4), 112 and 61(1) of the B.N.S. put up for hearing.</p> <p>2. Heard Shri Rajesh Kumar Sinha, learned Chief LADC for the petitioner as well as Shri Manoj Kumar Singh, learned P.P. for the State and perused the record including the case diary.</p> <p>3. Short case of the prosecution as per written complaint of the informant Amar Kumar, S.I., posted at Town P.S. is that during course of patrolling he got a secret information that one Navin Kumar along with other co-accused persons are preparing for unfairness in upcoming board examination and after informing the same to his superior, proceeded for Patel Nagar. It is stated that one person was apprehended with the help of raiding team, who disclosed his name as Navin Kumar and during course of search one Samsung Tab along with Airtel SIM bearing No.9199002757 as well as whatsapp chatting and admit card, 165 pages of answer sheet recovered from the room of Navin Kumar and one SAFETYNET GSM BOX with clear voice along with Jio Sim and bluetooth</p>

earbud bearing no.10882511, two cells of Sony watch have been recovered from the possession of the petitioner, Navin Kumar. Accordingly, the seizure list has been prepared and also a copy of the same handed over to the petitioner.

4. Learned Chief LADC for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner has no criminal antecedent and he is in custody since 16.02.2026. It has been further submitted that the petitioner is innocent rather he has falsely been implicated in the present case on the basis of suspicion. It has also been submitted that the petitioner is a student and living in a rented room. It is also submitted that alleged recovery of articles does not constitute the offence as alleged in the FIR, hence, the bail petition of the petitioner may be allowed.

On the contrary learned P.P. opposed the bail petition of the petitioner.

5. The petitioner is in custody since 16.02.2026 and he has no criminal antecedent. He is alleged to preparing for committing of adopting unfairness in the ensuing board examination. He has been apprehended for days prior to the alleged date of examination. It is alleged that one spy Bluetooth device and one spy Bluetooth earbud and two Sony watch cell have been recovered from his possession. It is also alleged that two admit cards are alleged to have found in his possession. Apart from that it is not clear whether the said admit cards whereof the examinee and whether he has

approached the said examinee to rigging in the ensuing examination. It is a case of mere preparation which does not reach to the stage of commission towards the offence, mere preparation cannot be treated as the offence under the B.N.S., 2022.

6. However without commenting over the merit of this case, this court thinks it fit just, proper and legal to admit the petitioner on bail. Accordingly, the prayer for regular bail of the accused-petitioner Navin Kumar is being **allowed** hereby and the petitioner is directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail-bonds of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court subject to the conditions that the petitioner shall not commit an offence similar to the offence of which he is accused, or suspected, of the commission of which he is suspected, the petitioner will not tamper with the evidence and he shall remain present on each and every date during the trial and if he fails to appear on two consecutive dates his bail-bonds shall be liable to be cancelled.
