An application for bail has been filed on behalf of the petitioners namely **1. Prince Kumar S/o Yadunandan Singh** who is in custody since **20-01-2026** in connection with **Warisaliganj P.S. Case No. 37/2026** U/ss 303(2), 318(2), 319(2), 336(4), 340(2), 338, 111(4), 61(2), 3(5) of BNS.

Prosecution story in brief is that on 19.01.2026 at around 10:05, the informant, Sub-Inspector, went on a patrol, during which secret information was received at 13:30 that some cyber criminals were sitting in a mango orchard 500 meters away from the village Apasadh and were committing cyber fraud on the common people. Upon reaching the spot with armed police, 9 persons started running away on seeing the police force. Four persons, including the accused Gautam Kumar, were apprehended. Three Android mobile phones were recovered from the spot in a discarded condition. During the search, two Android mobile phones and a one-page customer data sheet were found in the possession of the applicant accused. Android mobile phones and customer data sheets were also recovered from other co-accused individuals. During interrogation, the accused revealed that they lure people by promising loans in the name of Bajaj Finance and other companies. It is further alleged that cyber criminals first of all demand photocopies of their bank passbooks and Aadhaar cards, and then defraud them in the name of processing fees. Upon checking the SIM cards in the mobile phones, two SIM cards were recovered from the applicants found to be registered in the names of individuals from other states. The arrested individuals revealed the names of other accused who had fled away from the scene of the crime. Following this, a proper seizure list and arrest memo were prepared and all the arrested individuals were brought to the police station. They were arrested at the scene of the crime.

Ld. Counsel for the petitioner submit that petitioner is innocent and has not committed any offence as alleged. He has been falsely implicated in the case. Earlier no anticipatory or regular bail petition has been filed either before this court or before the Hon'ble High Court. Further it is submitted that petitioner is having no criminal antecedent. Petitioner is in custody since **20-01-2026**.

Learned APP opposed the prayer for bail of the petitioner.

Having heard learned counsel for the parties and on perusal of the materials available on record, it appears that the allegation against the petitioner relates to his involvement in organized cyber fraud activities, wherein innocent persons were allegedly lured on the pretext of providing loans and thereafter cheated in the name of processing fees. So far as petitioner **Prince Kumar** is concerned, it transpires that mobile phones have been recovered from his possession, though it is alleged that the said mobile phones belong to his wife. Moreover, his complicity appears to be based mainly on his presence at the place of occurrence along with other co-accused. There is nothing on record to indicate that he is having similar criminal antecedent. Petitioner is in custody since **20-01-2026** and has undergone sufficient period of custody.

Considering the above facts and circumstances of the case, I am inclined to enlarge the petitioner on bail. Accordingly petitioner is allowed on bail on furnishing bail bond of Rs 10,000/- with two sureties of the like amount to the satisfaction of the Court below.
