04.06.2026	This bail petition has been filed on behalf of the petitioner Vikash Kumar Singh, who is in custody since 21.04.2026 in connection with Nawada Town P.S. Case No. 402/2026 u/s 126(2), 115(2), 109(1), 132, 223, 324(4) and 3(5) of the B.N.S. put up for hearing. 2. Heard Shri Ramashish Prasad, learned counsel for the petitioner as well as Shri Manoj Kumar Singh, learned P.P. for the State and perused the record including the case diary. 3. Short case of the prosecution as per written complaint of the informant constable-Pramod Kumar, posted at Nawada Traffic Police Station is that on 20.04.2026 at about 03:00 P.M., he got information from SHO traffic that on the way from Sadbhawna to Hisua, there is traffic Jam near Sobhiya Mandir. It is stated that after getting information, informant along with other police constable reached at the place for clearing Jam, where, they saw a Tata Magic Vehicle bearing registration no.BR27GB0265 was standing in wrong side due to which the traffic Jam occurred at main road near Sobhiya Mandir on both lanes. It is alleged that when he told the driver to go on right side, the driver denied and when he tried to capture photo of vehicle, this petitioner started abusing and	

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fighting. It is also alleged that all the accused persons including this petitioner assaulted him with lathi-danda, etc. and the petitioner also snatched away his mobile phone.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner has got no criminal antecedent and he is in custody since 26.04.2026. It has been further submitted that the petitioner is innocent rather he has falsely been implicated in the present case. It has also been submitted that the petitioner is suffering from kidney disease and his treatment is going on, hence, the bail petition of the petitioner may be allowed.

On the contrary learned P.P. opposed the bail petition of the petitioner.

5. The petitioner is alleged to be driver of the vehicle due to which Jam has been created at Shobhiya temple. Some altercation took place between this accused-petitioner and other co-accused and the Traffic Jawan. There is allegation of assaulting Traffic Jawan by accused petitioner along with other co-accused. Petitioner has no criminal antecedent and he is in custody since 21.04.2026. The injury report has been brought on record, which shows, the injury suffered by Traffic Jawan, Pramod Kumar is swelling and reddish black colour around left eye and pain in neck and headache. Mild soft tissue swelling was found in right parietal region. The injury was found to be simple in

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nature.

6. In view of the above this court thinks it fit just, proper and legal to admit the petitioner on bail. Accordingly, the prayer for regular bail of the accused-petitioner Vikash Kumar Singh is being **allowed** hereby and the petitioner is directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail-bonds of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court subject to the conditions that the petitioner shall not commit an offence similar to the offence of which he is accused, or suspected, of the commission of which he is suspected, the petitioner will not tamper with the evidence and he shall remain present on each and every date during the trial and if he fails to appear on two consecutive dates his bail-bonds shall be liable to be cancelled.
