This anticipatory bail petition has been filed on behalf of the petitioners 1.Dayanand Yadav, 2.Chameli Devi and 3.Pravesh Kumar, who are apprehending their arrest in connection with Nemdarganj P.S. Case No.174/2026 u/ss. 126(2), 115(2), 352, 351(3), 80(2) and 3(5) of the B.N.S and put up for hearing. 2. Heard Shri Anjani Kumar, learned counsel for the petitioners as well as Shri Manoj Kumar Singh, learned P.P. for the State. Perused the record including the case diary. 3. The short case of the prosecution as per the written typed statement of the informant Guddu Kumar is that marriage of his sister, namely, Binita Kumari was solemnized four years ago with Sonu Yadav and he had given cash of Rs.6,00,000/- and other gold as well as silver jewelleries, etc as wedding gift as per his capacity and they were living happily and peacefully. It is stated that thereafter accused/ husband-Sonu Kumar demanded an amount of Rs.2,00,000/- to open a medical shop as additional dowry, which was communicated by his sister and the same was fulfilled by him. is further stated that after few months the husband of the deceased sister told to demand again an additional dowry amount of Rs.10,00,000/-, which was denied by the informant as he is not capable to do so. It is alleged that all the accused persons including these petitioners started abusing and assaulting to his sister and started demanding additional amount of dowry. It is further alleged that they started harassing and torturing to the deceased sister of the informant. It is further alleged that when his sister and his brother-in-law went to participate in a marriage function at Kango Bigha, there she was assaulted by her husband in presence of brother of the informant, namely, Mantu Kumar, who anyhow pacified the dispute. It is also alleged that they committed murder of his sister due to non-fulfillment of demand of dowry, which was informed to his mauseri sister, Neha Kumari, through video call by accused/husband-Sonu Yadav by mobile no.7304781535 and the same was conveyed to his sister-in-law (Bhabhi) on mobile no.9162217941 by his mauseri sister and on the same information informant and his family members went to the matrimonial house of his deceased sister, where, they saw that no one were present there except dead-body of his sister, which was lying on bed.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners have no criminal antecedent. It has been submitted that petitioners are innocent and they have falsely been implicated in the present case. It has further been submitted that these petitioners are living separately and they have no concern with the domestic affairs of their son as well as daughter-in-law, where, petitioner no.1 is father-in-law and petitioner no.2 is mother-in-law of the deceased. It has further been submitted that no specific allegation has been levelled against these petitioners. Hence, anticipatory bail petition of the petitioners may be allowed.

On the contrary learned P.P. opposed the anticipatory bail petition of the petitioners.

5. These petitioners along with other co-accused was demanding dowry from the sister of the informant and when this was not fulfilled, the deceased was done to death. The postmortem report of the deceased, Binita Kumari has been brought on record, which shows on external examination - 1.rigor mortis present, 2.scar mark around neck, 3. lacerated wound present over right side cheek of size 1x0.5x1cm, 4. bruise present over B/L arm and forearm of size 10cm and 15 cm and 5. bruise present over B/L elbow of size 5x4cm and on dissection - hear-full of blood, lungs - B/L

Contd. 08.07.2026	lungs congested and edamatus and stomach - 200 ml digested food present. The reason for cause of death is suffocation due to strangulation. The deceased has been strangulated showing the diabolical and heinous manner in which the deceased has been done to death. 6. In view of the above this court is not inclined to enlarge the petitioners on bail. Accordingly, the prayer for anticipatory bail of the accused-petitioners, namely, 1.Dayanand Yadav, 2.Chameli Devi and 3.Pravesh Kumar is being <u>rejected</u> hereby.
