02.06.2026	This bail petition has been filed on behalf of the petitioner, Dwarika Prasad, who is in custody since 07.05.2026 in connection with Sirdalla P.S. Case No. 111/2026 u/s 126(2), 115(2), 109, 74, 303(2), 324(4), 352, 351(2) and 3(5) of the B.N.S. put up for hearing. 2. Heard Shri Sanjay Kumar Priyadarshi, learned counsel for the petitioner as well as Shri Manoj Kumar Singh, learned P.P. for the State and perused the record including the case diary. 3. Short case of the prosecution as per the written statement of the informant Alka Kumari is that on 17.04.2026 at about 09:45 P.M., she along with her husband were going to her newly constructed house of her <i>Maika</i> from her matrimonial house. It is alleged that while they were crossing the house of accused-Vikas Kumar suddenly attacked upon the informant and tried to outrage her modesty. It is further alleged that petitioner-Vikas Kumar pressed her neck by means of Gamchha with intention to kill her and when her husband tried to save her, he also assaulted her husband by means of iron rod. It is alleged that he also snatched gold chains from the neck of the informant as well as her husband. It is further alleged that anyhow they managed	

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to save themselves and reached at her maika. It is also alleged that the accused persons along with these petitioners equipped with various weapon entered into her parental house and started abusing and damaged four-wheeler bearing registration no.BR10AC9889 and CCTV installed in the house. It is also alleged that accused-Dwarika Prasad ordered them to put on fire their house and vehicle.

4. Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner has got no criminal antecedent and he is in custody since 07.05.2026. It has been further submitted that the petitioner is innocent rather he has falsely been implicated in the present case. It has also been submitted that there is case and counter case in between the parties, hence, the bail petition of the petitioner may be allowed.

On the contrary learned P.P. opposed the bail petition of the petitioner.

5. The petitioner is in custody since 07.05.2026 and he has no criminal antecedent. There is case and counter case between the parties. The allegation against him is that he incited the other co-accused to assault the informant and her husband. The injury report has been brought on record, which shows that the husband of the informant, namely, Vinod Kumar suffered redness in right eye and bruise on neck and bodyache. The X-ray was taken of chest-AP, the study is within normal limit. The

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injury was found to be simple in nature caused by hard and blunt substance and injury found on the person of the informant Alka Kumari was found to be headache. No significant abnormality was found in the CT-brain.

6. In view of the above this court thinks it fit just, proper and legal to admit the petitioner on bail. Accordingly, the prayer for regular bail of the accused-petitioner, Dwarika Prasad is being **allowed** hereby and the petitioner is directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail-bonds of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court subject to the conditions that the petitioner shall not commit an offence similar to the offence of which he is accused, or suspected, of the commission of which he is suspected, the petitioner will not tamper with the evidence and he shall remain present on each and every date during the trial and if he fails to appear on two consecutive dates his bail-bonds shall be liable to be cancelled.
