06.06.2026	This bail petition has been filed on behalf of the petitioner Raushan Kumar who is in custody since 08.05.2026 in connection with Parnadabar P.S. Case No.32/2026 u/s. 126(2), 115(2), 117(2), 118(1), 303(2), 109, 74, 351(2), 351(3), 352 and 3(5) of the B.N.S. put up for hearing. 2. Heard Shri Sanjay Kumar Priyadarshi, learned counsel for the petitioner as well as Shri Manoj Kumar Singh, learned P.P. for the State and perused the record including the case diary. 3. Short case of the prosecution as per the written statement of the informant is that on 04.03.2026 at about 07:30 P.M. when he was in his home, co-accused, namely, Pawan Kumar and accused petitioner-Roshan Kumar came there and started abusing him. It is alleged that on protest, then the co-accused Pawan Kumar assaulted him by means of handle of Chapda and accused petitioner-Roshan Kumar assaulted by means of Garasa. It is further alleged that when his wife came to save him, they also tried to outrage the modesty of his wife. It is also alleged they snatched away gold locket from the neck of the informant and they threatened to kill him, too. 4. Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner has got no criminal

It has been further submitted that the petitioner is innocent rather he has falsely been implicated in the present case and he has not committed any offence, as alleged. Hence, the bail petition of the petitioner may be allowed. On the contrary learned P.P. opposed the bail petition of the petitioner. 5. The petitioner is in custody since 08.05.2026 and he has no criminal antecedent. In the body of the FIR, the informant stated that he has been assaulted by this particular petitioner by sharp cutting edged weapon, like, Garasa, whereas, in para 6 of the case diary, which contains the statement of the wife of the informant, in which she stated that this accused assaulted by stick. Further, other two witnesses in para 7 and 8 of the case diary also stated same thing that they had seen the accused petitioner assaulted the informant by stick. The injury report also corroborate the same that the injury has been caused by stick not by sharp cutting edged weapon, like, Garasa. The injury report has been brought on record, which shows, scalp injury on parietal region of size 2"X1"X1" and whole body pain but supplementary injury report states, no bony lesin are seen in lungs, no fractures are seen in ribs skiogram, bony throax diasphragm case appears normal. In CT-brain 3D-mild soft tissue hematoma in right frontal, left	
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frontoparietotemporal region. The injury was found to be simple in nature and caused by hard and blunt substance and not by the sharp cutting edged weapon.

6. In view of the above this court thinks it fit just, proper and legal to admit the petitioner on bail. Accordingly, the prayer for regular bail of the accused-petitioner Raushan Kumar is being **allowed** hereby and the petitioner is directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail-bonds of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten thousand) with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court subject to the conditions that the petitioner shall not commit an offence similar to the offence of which he is accused, or suspected, of the commission of which he is suspected, the petitioner will not tamper with the evidence and he shall remain present on each and every date during the trial and if he fails to appear on two consecutive dates his bail-bonds shall be liable to be cancelled.
