15.07.2026	1. This anticipatory bail petition has been filed on behalf of the petitioners 1. Mintu Kumar, 2. Mithilesh Kumar, 3. Ranjit Kumar, 4. Sharwan Kumar and 5. Sado (Meha) Kumar @ Nepal Kumar who are apprehending their arrest in connection with Muffasil P.S. Case No.160/2026 u/ss. 126(2), 115(2), 110,341(2), 352 and 62(2) of the B.N.S and put up for hearing. 2. Heard Shri Nawal Kishore Pd. Verma, learned counsel for the petitioners as well as Shri Manoj Kumar Singh, learned P.P. for the State. Perused the record including the case diary. 3. Short case of the prosecution as per written complaint of the informant Arun Kumar Malakar is that on 13.05.26 at 09:00 P.M. five-six boys were drinking wine in his land situated near his house and they were damaging the crop and when he requested not to do the same in his field all the accused persons abused and assaulted him and his brother due to which his brother sustained injury on his head. 4. Learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners have got no

criminal antecedent. It has been further submitted that the petitioners are innocent rather they have falsely been implicated in the present case. It has also been submitted that there is no specific allegation levelled against them rather the same is general and omnibus in nature, hence, the bail petition of the petitioners may be allowed.

On the contrary learned P.P. opposed the anticipatory bail petition of the petitioners.

5. There is general and omnibus allegation levelled against these petitioners of assaulting the informant and his brother. The injury report brought on record shows the injury suffered by informant Arun Kumar Malakar is simple in nature. The injury suffered by Varun Kumar, the brother of the informant is also simple in nature. Charge-sheet has already been submitted against the petitioners vide charge sheet no. 230/2026 dated 31.05.2026. The petitioners have no criminal antecedent.

6. In view of the above, this court thinks it fit just, proper and legal to admit the petitioners on anticipatory bail. Accordingly, the prayer for anticipatory bail of the accused-petitioners 1. Mintu Kumar, 2. Mithilesh Kumar, 3. Ranjit Kumar, 4. Sharwan Kumar and 5. Sado (Meha) Kumar @ Nepal Kumar are being **allowed** hereby and it is ordered that in the event of surrender/arrest within four weeks from today the petitioners shall be released on bail on

furnishing bail bond of Rs.10,000/- (Ten thousand) each with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned court below subject to the conditions as laid down u/s 482(2) of the B.N.S.S. with further conditions that the petitioners shall make themselves available for interrogation by a police officer as and when required and the petitioners shall not, directly or indirectly, make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer, the petitioners shall remain present on each and every date during the trial and if the petitioners fail to appear on two consecutive dates their bail-bonds shall be liable to be cancelled.
