No.1345/2026 & B.P.No. 1826/2026 have been filed on behalf of the petitioners, namely, Brajesh Kumar and Abdul Rehman respectively where petitioners are in custody since 15.05.2026 and 16.05.2026 respectively in connection with Warisaliganj P.S. Case No.322/2026 u/ss. 303(2) of the B.N.S. put up for hearing. B.P. No.1345/2026 & B.P.No. 1826/2026 are being disposed hereby by this common order as both the petitions arising out of same police station case number i.e. Warisaliganj P.S. Case No.322/2026. 2. Heard Shri Ranjeet Kumar (in B.P. No.1345/2026) and Shri Sanjay Kumar Priyadarshi (In B.P. No.1826/2026), learned counsels' for the petitioners as well as Shri Manoj Kumar Singh, learned P.P. for the State and perused the record including the case diary. 3. The short case of the prosecution as per written complaint of the informant Mantu Rawat is that on 06.05.2026 at about 10:00 P.M. he had tied his buffalo in a peg beneath Margosa (Neem)	

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tree in front of his house and slept after taking dinner. It is stated that he could not see there his buffalo in the next day morning and could not traced his buffalo after making his best effort to search out his buffalo. It is alleged that some unknown person has taken away his buffalo.

4. Learned counsels for the petitioners jointly submitted that the petitioners have no criminal antecedent and they are in custody since 15.05.2026 and 16.05.2026 respectively. It has been further submitted that the petitioners are innocent and they have been falsely implicated in this case, where, petitioners are not named in the FIR and their names surfaced in the present case on the basis of confessional statement of other co-accused, namely, Sachin Kumar. It has also been submitted that nothing incriminating has been recovered from the possession of these petitioners. Hence bail petitions of the petitioners may be allowed.

On the contrary the learned P.P. opposed the prayer for bail of the petitioners.

5. The petitioners have no criminal antecedent. The allegations against petitioner-Brajesh Kumar is that he has stolen the buffalo of the informant and petitioner Abdul Rehman is stated to have received the purchased stolen buffalo from the accused-petitioner-Brajesh Kumar. Both the petitioners are in custody since 15.05.2026 and 16.05.2026 respectively. From perusal of the para 10 of the case diary, it is clear that from the

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inspection of the CCTV camera one white colour pick-up bearing registration no.BR27G2261 was carrying the said stolen buffalo on 07.05.2026 at about 05:30 A.M. The names of owners of said pickup vehicle was found to be Banwari Chaurasiya and in para 14 of the case diary, he has stated that his driver, drives the said pickup. In para 17 of the case diary, the said pickup vehicle has been seized. The accused-driver Sachin was arrested and he stated that the said buffalo was taken to Begusarai where the petitioner-Abdul Rehman purchased it from Brajesh Kumar, who has stolen the purchased buffalo. In para 21 of the case diary, through mobile number of petitioner Abdul Rehman was traced at Begusarai. In para 33 of the case diary, the said buffalo has been seized from the house of Abdul Rehman, who has accepted that he has purchased the same from petitioner-Brajesh Kumar by paying Rs.49,000/- on 07.05.2026. Petitioner-Abdul Rehman stated that he has no knowledge that the said buffalo was stolen. Petitioner-Brajesh Kumar is said to be the person who has stolen the buffalo of the informant. The buffalo has already been seized and handed over to the informant.

6. In view of the above this court thinks it fit just, proper and legal to admit the petitioners on bail. Accordingly, the prayer for regular bail of the accused-petitioners Brajesh Kumar and Abdul Rehman are being allowed hereby and the they are directed to be released on bail on furnishing bail-bonds of Rs. 10,000/- (Ten thousand) each

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with two sureties of the like amount each to the satisfaction of the learned trial court subject to the conditions that the petitioners shall not commit an offence similar to the offence of which they are accused, or suspected, of the commission of which they are suspected, they will not tamper with the evidence, they shall remain present on each and every date during trial and if they fail to appear on two consecutive dates their bail-bonds shall be liable to be cancelled.
