- 1.** The **petitioners** seek anticipatory bail in connection with **Ram Krishna Nagar P.S. Case No. 246 of 2026**, instituted for offences under Sections 115(2), 126(2), 190, 191(2), 303(2), and 352 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 (BNS).
- 2.** Heard Sri Binod Singh, learned counsel for the petitioners and Sri Rajesh Kumar, learned Public Prosecutor for the State
- 3.** As per the prosecution's version, narrated by the informant Sachin Kumar, on 12.03.2026 at about 4:00 AM, he was returning home in his car when Ganesh DJ had parked a DJ trolley in the middle of the road near Dhelvan Post Office. On being asked to remove the vehicle, he refused. It is alleged that the petitioners, along with co-accused Jitendra Kumar, Ganesh Kumar, and three unidentified persons, assaulted the informant and his brother with lathis, sticks, and belts, causing head injuries. Further, the accused allegedly snatched his gold chain and locket before fleeing. It is also alleged that petitioner No.2 Bunt Kumar threatened to abduct him within a month and forcibly took away two machines from his warehouse.
- 4.** Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the only non-bailable offence alleged is under Section 303(2) BNS, which carries a maximum punishment of five years and is triable by a Magistrate. He contends that the allegations of assault and snatching are vague and omnibus, and that the petitioners have been falsely implicated due to rivalry in the DJ service business. Learned counsel fairly submits that **petitioner No. 1 has four prior criminal antecedents** (i) Ram Krishna Nagar P.S. Case No. 841/2023 under the Excise Act, (ii) Ram Krishna Nagar P.S. Case No. 649/2024 under Sections 109, 303(2), and allied provisions of BNS, (iii) Ram Krishna Nagar P.S. Case No. 153/2020 under Section 379 and allied provisions of IPC, and (iv)

Ram Krishna Nagar P.S. Case No. 772/2019 under Section 379 and allied provisions of IPC. **Petitioner No. 2 has three prior antecedents** (i) Ram Krishna Nagar P.S. Case No. 772/2019 under Section 379 and allied provisions of IPC, (ii) Ram Krishna Nagar P.S. Case No. 649/2024 under Sections 109, 303(2), and allied provisions of BNS, and (iii) Ram Krishna Nagar P.S. Case No. 153/2020 under Section 379 and allied provisions of IPC.

5. The learned Public Prosecutor opposes the prayer for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.
6. **Upon perusal of paragraph 37 of the case diary, it appears that the Investigating Officer has recorded that petitioners are accused in Ram Krishna Nagar P.S. Case No. 263/2025, which was not disclosed in the anticipatory bail application. As such, petitioner No. 1 has five criminal antecedents and Petitioner No. 2 has four antecedents. Thus, petitioners have suppressed one criminal antecedent i.e., Ram Krishna Nagar P.S. Case No. 263/2025, thereby have not approached the Court with clean hands, disentitling them from the privilege of anticipatory bail.**
7. Having regard to the fact that the petitioners have concealed their criminal antecedent and not approached this Court with clean hands, this Court is not inclined to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner. Accordingly, the present anticipatory bail application stands **rejected**.
