1. This regular bail application is preferred by **Md. Rahim and Md. Sagir** who are incarcerated since 30.01.2026, in connection with **Mal Salami P.S. Case No.58/2026** dated 30.01.2026, registered for offences punishable under Section 21(c) of NDPS Act and Section 111 of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, BNS 2023.
2. Heard Md. Ilyas Ansary, learned counsel for the accused-petitioners and Sri Ashok Kumar Sinha, learned Spl. PP on behalf of the State.
3. The prosecution case in short is that on 29.01.2026 at about 20:30 hours, the accused Mukesh Kumar, Guddu Kumar @ Duddu Kumar and petitioner No.1 Md. Rahim were smuggling contraband cough syrup by vehicles. Acting on the information, the police apprehended them and upon search recovered 1600 liters of WISCOREX cough syrup each from vehicles bearing Nos. BR01GM8821 and BR01GL2151. On their disclosure, further recovery of 930 liters of cough syrup from vehicle No. BR01GC5227 and 355 liters from vehicle No. BR01BM9012 was made. The accused disclosed that the consignment was bought from Himachal Pradesh with the involvement of petitioner No. 2 Md. Sagir and co-accused Surya Prakash, Mithilesh Kumar and Md. Parvej.
4. Learned counsel for the petitioners submitted that the petitioners are innocent, committed no offence and have no criminal antecedent. It was further submitted that the petitioners have falsely been implicated in this case and there is no independent witness to the alleged seizure. It was next submitted that the alleged recovery is not restricted by the drug authority and the petitioners are labourers. The petitioners are in custody since 30.01.2026. On these grounds, prayed for privilege of regular bail.
5. Per contra, learned Special Public Prosecutor vehemently opposed the bail application and submitted that 1600 liters of WISCOREX cough syrup has been

recovered from the possession of petitioner No.1 Md. Rahim and petitioner No.2 Md. Sagir was the seller of the said consignment. It was further submitted that investigation is going on and charge sheet is yet to be submitted against this petitioner. The allegation against the petitioner is serious in nature. Therefore, the petitioner does not deserve the privilege of regular bail.

6. Considering the nature of accusation; the accused Mukesh Kumar, Guddu Kumar @ Duddu Kumar and petitioner No.1 Md. Rahim were smuggling contraband cough syrup by vehicles and petitioner no.2 Md. Sagir was named as the supplier of the said articles, which falls under the category of commercial quantity as per Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985; nature of offence, i.e. severity of punishment in the event of conviction and; that investigation is ongoing and chargesheet is awaited, this Court is of the opinion that it is not a fit case for grant of regular bail to the petitioner.
7. Accordingly, this regular bail application filed on behalf of the petitioners **Md. Rahim and Md. Sagir** is hereby **rejected**.
