1. This regular bail application is preferred by **Anshu Raj Kumar**, who is incarcerated since 08.03.2026, in connection with **Agamkuan P.S. Case No.228/2026** dated 07.03.2026, registered for offences punishable under Sections 21, 22 of NDPS Act.
2. Heard Sri Laleshwar Pd. Singh, learned counsel for the accused-petitioner and Sri Ashok Kumar Sinha, learned Spl. PP on behalf of the State.
3. The prosecution case briefly put is that on 07.03.2026 the police apprehended three persons including the petitioner Ansh Raj Kumar who were attempted to flee with cartons and bags containing medicines. On search, 10800 tablets of Alprazolam (0.5 mg each) total 5.4 grams, was recovered from the possession of the accused persons.
4. Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is innocent, committed no offence and has no criminal antecedent. It was further submitted that the petitioner has falsely been implicated in this case and the alleged recovery does not belong to the petitioner. Thus, the petitioner had no concern with the alleged occurrence. The petitioner is in custody since 08.03.2026. On these grounds, prayed for privilege of regular bail.
5. Per contra, learned Special Public Prosecutor vehemently opposed the bail application and submitted that 10800 tablets of Alprazolam (0.5 mg each) total 5.4 grams has been recovered from the possession of the accused persons. It was further submitted that investigation is going on and charge sheet is yet to be submitted against this petitioner. The allegation against the

petitioner is serious in nature. Therefore, the petitioner does not deserve the privilege of regular bail.

6. Considering the nature of accusation; quantum of total recovery, i.e. 10800 tablets of Alprazolam (0.5 mg each) total 5.4 grams has been recovered from the possession of the accused persons, which falls beyond the category of small quantity as per Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act, 1985; nature of offence, i.e. severity of punishment in the event of conviction and; that investigation is ongoing and chargesheet is awaited, this Court is of the opinion that it is not a fit case for grant of regular bail to the petitioner.
7. Accordingly, this regular bail application filed on behalf of the petitioner **Anshu Raj Kumar** is hereby **rejected**.
