1. The present application for regular bail has been filed on behalf of the **accused-petitioner, Abhimanu Singh**, who has remained in custody since 23.04.2026, in connection with **Rupaspur P.S. Case No. 292/2026** dated 22.04.2026, registered under Sections 8(c)/21(b) of NDPS Act.
2. Heard Sri Arun Kumar Tiwari, learned counsel for the accused-petitioner and Sri Ashok Kumar Sinha, learned Spl. PP on behalf of the State.
3. The allegation against the petitioner is that on 22.04.2026, at approximately 17:50 hours, acting on confidential information, the police conducted a raid at a house located on Shivaji Marg. On noticing the police presence, three persons, including the petitioner Abhimanu Singh, along with co-accused Raj Narayan Choubey and Suresh Kumar Singh, attempted to escape but were apprehended. A search of the premises led to the recovery of 158 grams of smack and ₹48,000 in cash. Also, mobile phones and ₹9,000 in cash were seized from the possession of the petitioner, Abhimanu Singh.
4. Learned counsel for the petitioner argued that the petitioner is innocent, has been falsely implicated, and has no connection with the seized contraband. It was further submitted that the petitioner has no prior criminal record and that the mandatory provisions of the NDPS Act were not duly followed by the investigating authorities. The petitioner has been in judicial custody since 23.04.2026, and on these grounds, a prayer was made for grant of regular bail.

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5. *Per contra*, learned Special Public Prosecutor opposed the bail application, contending that the recovery of 158 grams of smack exceeds the threshold of small quantity under the NDPS Act. He further submitted that the investigation is still in progress and the charge sheet has not yet been filed. In view of the seriousness of the allegations, it was argued that the petitioner is not entitled to regular bail.
6. Having regard to the nature of the accusation; the quantum of recovery of **158 grams of smack**, which far exceeds the threshold of small quantity under the Narcotic Drugs & Psychotropic Substances Act; the submissions advanced by the learned Special Public Prosecutor; and the fact that the investigation is ongoing and the charge sheet is yet to be submitted, this Court is of the view that the present case does not warrant grant of regular bail.
7. Accordingly, the application for regular bail filed on behalf of the **petitioner, Abhimanu Singh**, stands **rejected**.
