- 1.** The **petitioners, who are real brothers**, apprehend arrest in connection with **Ram Krishna Nagar P.S. Case No. 246 of 2026**, instituted for offences under Sections 115(2), 126(2), 190, 191(2), 303(2), and 352 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, 2023 (BNS).
- 2.** Heard Sri Binod Singh, learned counsel for the petitioners and Sri Rajesh Kumar, learned Public Prosecutor for the State.
- 3.** As per the prosecution's version, narrated by the informant Sachin Kumar, on 12.03.2026 at about 4:00 AM, he was returning home in his car when Ganesh DJ had parked a DJ trolley in the middle of the road near Dhelvan Post Office. On being asked to remove the vehicle, he refused. It is alleged that the petitioners, along with co-accused Dinesh Kumar, Buntty Kumar, and three unidentified persons, assaulted the informant and his brother with lathis, sticks, and belts, causing head injuries. Further, the accused allegedly snatched his gold chain and locket before fleeing. It is also alleged that co-accused Buntty Kumar threatened to abduct him within a month and forcibly took away two machines from his warehouse.
- 4.** Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that the only non-bailable offence alleged is under Section 303(2) of the BNS, which prescribes a maximum punishment of five years imprisonment and is triable by a Magistrate. He further contends that the allegations of assault and snatching are vague and omnibus, and that the petitioners have been falsely implicated due to rivalry in the DJ service business. Learned counsel acknowledges that petitioner No.1 has one prior antecedent in Ram Krishna Nagar P.S. Case No. 841/2023 under the Excise Act, while petitioner No.2 is implicated in an earlier case, Ram Krishna Nagar P.S. Case No.

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772/2019, under Section 379 and allied provisions of the IPC.

5. The learned Public Prosecutor opposes the prayer for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners.
6. Considering the facts and circumstances of the case; the nature of the offences and the punishment prescribed; the nature of accusation being general and omnibus nature; and the submissions advanced on behalf of the petitioners, the prayer for anticipatory bail is **allowed**. It is directed that in the event of arrest or surrender before the learned court below within four weeks from the date of receipt of this order, the petitioners shall be released on bail upon furnishing a bail bond of Rs.10,000/- (Rupees Ten Thousand) each with two sureties of the like amount to the satisfaction of the learned court below, subject to the conditions laid down under Section 482(2) of the BNSS.
