1. The present application for regular bail has been filed on behalf of the **accused-petitioner, Munna Kumar**, who is in custody since 07.04.2026, in connection with **Maner P.S. Case No. 320/2026** dated 06.04.2026, registered under Sections 20(b)(ii)(B) of the NDPS Act.
2. Heard Sri Arun Kumar Sinha, learned counsel for the accused-petitioner and Sri Ashok Kumar Sinha, learned Spl. PP on behalf of the State.
3. The allegation against the petitioner is that on 06.04.2026, at approximately 10:00 AM, during a police raid conducted at the residence of the petitioner, Munna Kumar, along with co-accused Vikash Kumar at Nilkanth Tola, Maner, a search of the premises resulted in the recovery of 3.9 kilograms of ganja.
4. Learned counsel for the petitioner submitted that the petitioner is innocent, has no prior criminal antecedents, and has been falsely implicated merely on suspicion. It was further contended that no contraband was recovered from his personal possession and that the mandatory provisions of the NDPS Act were not duly complied with by the investigating authorities. The petitioner has remained in judicial custody since 07.04.2026, and on these grounds, a prayer was made for grant of regular bail.
5. *Per contra*, learned Special Public Prosecutor opposed the bail application, asserting that 3.9 kilograms of ganja was recovered from the petitioner's residence. He further submitted that the investigation is still in progress and the

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charge sheet has not yet been filed. Considering the gravity of the allegations, it was argued that the petitioner is not entitled to regular bail.

6. In view of the nature of the accusation; the quantum of recovery (3.9 kilograms of ganja), which exceeds the threshold of small quantity under the NDPS Act; the submissions advanced by the learned Special Public Prosecutor; and the fact that the investigation is ongoing with the charge sheet yet to be filed, this Court is of the considered opinion that the present case does not warrant the grant of regular bail.
7. Accordingly, the application for regular bail filed on behalf of the **petitioner, Munna Kumar**, stands **rejected**.
