- 1.** The present application for regular bail has been filed on behalf of the **accused-petitioners namely, Meera Singh and Bipin Kumar**, who are incarcerated in judicial custody since 19.05.2026 in connection with **Agamkuan P.S. Case No. 520/2026** dated 18.05.2026, registered **under Sections 8/20(b)(ii)(c)/29 of the NDPS Act.**
- 2.** Heard Sri Akhilesh Kumar, learned counsel for the accused-petitioner and Sri Ashok Kumar Sinha, learned Spl. PP on behalf of the State.
- 3.** The prosecution asserts that on 18.05.2026, at approximately 7:20 PM, acting on confidential information, the police conducted a raid at the residence of Sima Kumari located at Patel Path, Road No. 8. On sighting the police, the petitioners, Bipin Kumar and Meera Singh, attempted to escape but were apprehended. During interrogation, they allegedly admitted to storing ganja in their room for sale and disclosed that the contraband was supplied by Manoj Kumar of Nandlal Chapra, Ramkrishna Nagar, Patna. A subsequent **search of their room resulted in the recovery of 23.66 kilograms of ganja**, which was weighed, seized, and duly recorded in the seizure memo. Consequently, the petitioners, along with Manoj Kumar, were implicated and arrested in connection with the case.
- 4.** Learned counsel for the petitioners contended that they are innocent, have no prior criminal record, and have been falsely implicated merely on suspicion. It was further argued that no incriminating material was recovered from their direct possession. Learned counsel emphasized that the petitioners have remained in judicial custody

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since 19.05.2026 and that the mandatory provisions of the NDPS Act were not properly adhered to during the investigation. On these grounds, a plea was made for the grant of regular bail.

5. On the other hand, the learned Special Public Prosecutor opposed the bail application, maintaining that 23.66 kilograms of ganja was recovered from the petitioners' premises. It was further submitted that the investigation is going on and the charge-sheet is yet to be submitted. Given the seriousness of the allegations, the prosecution argued that the petitioners are not entitled to the concession of bail.
6. Considering the nature of accusation, the quantum of recovery, i.e., **23.66 kilograms of ganja** which falls in the category of 'commercial quantity' under the NDPS Act; the rival submissions of learned counsel for the parties; and the fact that the investigation is going on and the charge-sheet is yet to be submitted, this Court is not inclined to grant bail to the petitioners.
7. Accordingly, the regular bail application filed on behalf of **petitioners namely, Meera Singh and Bipin Kumar**, stands **rejected**.
